Section I. Issues

KZMK, KWCD and KTAN have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. **Children's Services, Local Fundraisers, Community Events.** The Boys and Girls Club of Sierra Vista worked with the community for Golf Tournament Fundraiser to support the Boys and Girls Club organization. They work closely with partnerships like the radio station and other community members to raise funds for the club which offers kids a safe place after school, while keeping the kids interested in a variety of activities.
- B. **Veterans Affairs, Veteran Services, Suicide Prevention.** Volunteers from the Warrior Healing Center discussed veteran issues in our community. Moving toward a unification of services for veterans and how to continue the conversation of "22 to end 22" – a program implemented to help veterans cope with the high rate of suicide amongst veterans and soldiers.
- C. **Preservation of History, Fundraising for Local Historical Charities.** The Southwest Association of Buffalo Soldiers works to preserve the legacy and history of the Buffalo Soldier. A unique feature of Cochise County history, the group continues the legacy of the Buffalo Soldier by informing the public and working to preserve an historic building on Fort Huachuca that originally housed the black soldiers in our area. Fundraising and membership drives keep this organization going. They also support "sister organizations" like the Greater Sierra Vista Area NAACP and the Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial in Sierra Vista as well as related annual events.
- D. **Military Support, Events, Changing Information.** Fort Huachuca is a large part of the Cochise County Community. Events on Fort Huachuca, as well as command changes impact our soldiers and civilians working on the Fort. Many events are held on the fort with community support. The commander stepped aside and gave command to another. Discussion on the impact of this change and what it means for Cochise County and the Fort was an ongoing topic throughout this quarter.
- E. **Human Trafficking, High Speed Chases, Border Issues.** Frequent conversations on the increasing border issues, and the many high-speed chases that have become a danger to our communities in Cochise County. What local law enforcement teams work together to enforce safety issues and help mitigate human trafficking and human smuggling throughout Cochise County.
