10/1/13

Economy:

11/14/13

11/15/13

Weather:

11/17/13

11/17/13

11/18/13

11/18/13

Economy:

At the Traverse City Commission meeting, the topic of discussion was the possibility of limiting festivals, due to 'festival fatigue' in the community. Many in the community came forward and expressed how they're in favor of several festivals as a way to boost the economy throughout the year.

11/20/13

Weather:

Farmers are working to stay ahead of the weather that could wipe out the rest of their corn crop. They are trying to harvest as much as they can before the snow harms their crop. Falmouth Co-Op reports most cornfields are only half harvested.

11/20/13

Affordable Care Act:

Most local hospitals are behind the health care reform, due to the fact that providing health coverage for all is good for people's health. Freeing up the emergency room is a priority for Munson Medical Center and hospitals everywhere and people who are uninsured tend to use ER as their primary care physician.

11/21/13

Economy:

11/22/13

Weather:

The incoming snow has winter businesses like Classic Motor Sports in Traverse City seeing a spike in snowmobile tune ups. Mount Holiday says this is the earliest in 6 years they've got things ready for the upcoming ski season, due to the high snow amounts.

11/24/13

Weather:

Fife Lake was hit the hardest with the recent snowfall, receiving 10 inches.

11/26/13

Weather:

Snowy and slick roads played a part in a crash that closed part of U.S. 31 in Mason County this evening.

11/26/13

Holiday Travel:

Cherry Capital reminds flyers to keep checking with their airline to see if there are delays or cancellations on connecting flights due to our weather issues and an East Coast storm, during this upcoming holiday travel time.

11/26/13

Economy:

The Antrim County Commission on Aging suspended 3 programs and laid off 12 employees for the rest of 2013, due to a budget shortfall. The cuts are due to money paid for snow removal last year and although the suspended programs will be brought back in 2014, it is unknown if the laid off employees will be brought back due to limited funds.

11/27/13

Economy:

11/29/13

12/03/13

Weather:

12/4/13

12/4/13

12/5/13

Winter Tourism:

Due to snowmobile trail #4 in Otsego County closing, many local business owners are very concerned about the impact they will endure. Many say that after the golf season ends, they depend on this income, as well as their employees throughout the winter months.

12/10/13

Weather:

Areas from Sault Ste. Marie to Whitefish Point will see 10-16" of snow with some isolated areas pushing two feet of snow.

12/10/13

Weather:

The first flight out of Cherry Capital Airport was cancelled due to hazardous travel conditions.

12/11/13

Weather:

Nearly 2 feet of snow has fallen and is continuing to fall in the Eastern U.P. at Whitefish Point.

12/11/13

Winter Tourism:

Although Northern Michigan has seen nothing but snow over the past few days, the fluffy snow is not ideal for riding. Also, groomers cannot start tending to the trails until there is about 8 inches of thick snow. Sno Trac Village says its bittersweet to see the snow this time of year and are hoping to get the snowmobile season rolling really soon.

12/12/13

Weather:

Ice roads and horrible weather conditions resulted in the close of U.S. 131 near Petoskey today.

12/13/13

Weather:

The constant snow fall is keeping tow truck companies busy.

12/14/13

Weather:

The cold weather Northern Michigan is experiencing has the U.S. Coast Guard beginning their ice-breaking operations on the St. Mary's River in the Eastern Upper Peninsula.

12/15/13

Weather:

Police were forced to close down a stretch of I-75 for a few hours today due to extreme weather conditions, which in turn, caused several accidents.

12/16/13

Weather:

First responders in Leelanau County used today's really cold temperatures to practice saving lives. They met with the Coast Guard this morning on Lake Leelanau for training in ice rescue situations.

12/17/13

Holiday Travel:

Triple A says nearly 3 million Michiganders will travel during the upcoming holiday, with 92% traveling by car, truck or van, with the rest by plane, bus or train.

12/17/13

Economy:

Wolverine Power Supply is nixing plans for a Rogers City plant, which would have brought many new jobs to Presque Isle and other surrounding counties.

12/19/13

Weather:

Freezing rain and sleet are likely with ice accumulations of 1/10" possible.

12/19/13

Economy:

A Tokyo based company is expanding its business in Northern Michigan, building a facility in Emmet County. 36 new jobs will be created.

12/23/13

Weather/Economy:

The snow is great for local businesses. Caberfae Peaks Ski Resort is packed, while the Cadillac Area Visitors Bureau reports that more than half of the hotels in the area are full between Christmas and New Years. The Bureau reports that every occupied hotel room generates about \$200 to \$300 each day for the local economy.

12/24/13
