Footy brought in student Gabe that has been in the Boys and Girls Club to give his experience. We also had representatives from Jessie Trice. This is where our students go for their doctor appointments. They discussed the different treatment options available and how they offer transportation for their clients, as a platform

to raise funds and local awareness for LOCAL charities in the tri-county area. It costs \$100 a quarter to join and 100% of the funds go directly back to charity. They hold event 4 times a year and have many ways to connect through social media.

Today's student corner was Kwan. He is here from the Keys and is in the culinary program. He has taken a shine to baking and is doing amazing things in the kitchen. He recently visited Miami Dade College to talk about his options.
