Today's show was with the Miami Dolphins. Their senior VP of Communications and Community Affairs Jason Jenkins and the Dolphins player Engagement Director Kaled Thornhill were on the show to discuss the Ross Initiative in Sports for Equality. This is a new program started by Stephen Ross in 2015. It is a non-profit organization dedicated to harnessing the unifying power of sport to advance race relations and drive social progress. The initiative is led by an alliance of professional sports leagues, organizations and media networks. Known as RISE, it's main objective is to use sports to bring people together enduring action and promote understanding. They encourage people to go to RISEtoWIN.org for more information.

They also spoke about the Miami Dolphins programs for the Youth. They say their mission is to emphasize the importance of education, physical fitness and making the right choices that are both healthy and safe. They like to ready the kids for the next phases of their lives by having them participate in Football Clinics and Camps, like the Dolphins JTC, Junior Training Camp.

Finally, they discussed the partnership between RISE and the Dolphins this year to recognize young football players and their families and coaches. They are seeking players that are committed to the game and the community. Once a week, they chose a mom, player, and coach. They get a plaque presented them at a game. They also receive tickets to a Phins game and a t-shirt. They will also be promoted on the Dolphins and RISE social media pages. They also said that four Dolphin players worked with RISE to create a tailgate party for each home game. The players will supply the food and tickets and they will have educational games as part of the party.

This picnic is sponsored by almost every city in Miami-Dade. The picnic is exclusively held for the law enforcement officers and their families and children that have been diagnosed with Autism. They even let the kids cook and serve the lunch.

The first guest today was Bridgett Parris. She is the President and Founder of the Kindah Foundation. The Kindah Foundation strives to unite people in the fight against Ovarian and Cervical Cancer. They would like to bring the disease more to the surface, so that people will be more open to sharing and talking about it. She says many women don't get checked before it's too late. HPV has a stigma surrounding it that women only get it if they are sexually promiscuous, so they want to educate the world so that they realize this could happen to anyone. Another philosophy is that no one should face cancer alone. For that reason, she launched the first ever Teal 5K Run/ Fun Walk. The proceeds will benefit survivors of Ovarian and Gynecologic Cancer. Hasbro has donated \$100,000 to partner with them on the Senior Pet program. Hasbro created cats and dog toys so that the seniors don't get lonely. They move and function like real animals, but they are fake so there is no care needed. This partnership works really well in nursing homes and the senior citizens are so grateful for the company. They also have a program with Subaru called Share the Love. Subaru gives \$250 to Meals on Wheels for every new vehicle they sell during the event period. It was important to them to come on and locally
