WVBZ-WTQR-WMKS-WPTI-WMAG provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **4-H Programs available in NC:** 4-H programs available to young people in Guilford County. 4-H now is nothing like the program used to be. It is no longer just a rural farm type program. Now young people can learn robotics and other type of tech skills in today's 4H.
- **Blood Drives and Red Cross Classes:** The need for blood donations goes up in the summer because of vacations and more people being outdoors and being involved in accidents. Donors can go online to make reservations to donate blood or they can go to any of the fixed donation sites in the triad. The Red Cross also offers training for life saving, baby sitting, CPR and many more things. Being certified by the Red Cross can help you make more money being a life guard or a baby sitter.
- **Conserving energy and saving money:** Tips on how to cut down on your energy consumption and save money. Lower your thermostat. Check your insulation. Replace insulation if necessary. Install a programmable thermostat. Look for the energy star logo when you buy appliances
- **Crime issues in Guilford County:** Sheriff Barnes discussed two local issues that happened in the Guilford County Jail recently. An escape and death of a prisoner. The escape occurred because procedures were not followed properly. Local officers in the jail were dealt with and disciplined because of the incident. Also discussed the unique circumstances of Guilford County having two large urban areas in the county resulting in having to duplicate services such as the courthouse and jail in both urban areas and the special problems that entails.
- **Disaster Relief:** The Local Red Cross is involved in lots of disaster relief incidents both locally and nationally. The Red Cross has sent volunteers to help out with the floods out west and to the tornado stricken areas in the midwest and the south. The Red Cross can always use volunteers to help out locally for events that happen in this area. The Red Cross will train the volunteers.
- **Fisher House:** Located in close proximity to the medical center or hospital it serves, each Fisher House consists of between 8 and 12 suites, with private bedrooms and baths. Families share a common kitchen, laundry facilities, spacious dining room and an inviting living room with a library and toys for children. Fisher House Foundation ensures that there is no fee to stay in a Fisher House. Since 1990, the foundation has saved military, veterans and their

families an estimated \$200 million in out of pocket costs for lodging and transportation.

During the last four years of economic difficulty, the number of people we (tm)re serving has grown from 135,000 to well over 300,000, including 100,000 children. Many seeking food assistance never imagined they'd have to turn for help to feed their families. Together with our network of more than 400 partner food assistance programs, supported by compassionate and generous community of donors and volunteers, Second Harvest Food Bank of Northwest NC is helping to ensure no one goes without food in their time of need.
