A new study shows more Texans have health insurance since the Affordable Care Act took effect. According to Rice University's Baker Institute and the Episcopal Health Foundation 378,000 more Texans have health insurance today than September 2013. Even with those newly insured people, Texas has more uninsured adults than any other state in the country. The report says about 20 percent of uninsured people in Texas are undocumented and not eligible for insurance under the Affordable Care Act.
