Issues October 2014

Issues

1. Private citizen challenges charge on energy bill
2. Immigration rights
3. Prisoners rehab

October 1st – Mrs. Evelyn Lago, decided to contest the “fuel adjustment charge” on her electric bill, because it is higher than the consumption charge. She wishes to start a movement, since everyone is subject to the same extravagant charge.

October 10 – Mr. Rolando Acosta, exposed all the obstacles he has confronted looking for assistance in the Municipality of San Juan, because of his foreigner status.

October 27 – Woman who has her son in prison, exposes the severity of the conditions inside and asks for help.

Issues November 2014

Issues

1. Community baseball field in need of illumination
2. Toll charges
3. Illegal construction permits

November 4 – Nemesio Canales Public Housing community advocate, implores to the government agencies to repair the lights of the community baseball park, so children of the community’s little leagues, can practice and play. They have been damaged since September.

November 17 – Various citizens called insistently on toll booth charges they have received by mail. Each allegation was investigated and the host wrote a letter to the local transportation agency contesting the charges.

November 20 – Mr. Rodríguez, a Toa Alta City Council Member, brought a complaint against the Engineers Association and Permits Office, because of illegal construction permits being granted.

Issues December 2014

Issues

1. Community baseball field in need of illumination
2. Toll charges
3. Protest against closing of public school
4. Parents and students claim against the unjustified exit of school director

December 4 – Mr. Mon Rivera, little league coach, brought the attention to another baseball field in need of illumination in Puerto Nuevo. He established the importance of these community spaces to be in top shape, in order to help keep our youth focused on positive engagements.

December 5 – Because of the success obtained by the program regarding the letter sent by the host contesting toll booth charges received by mail on November, other citizens called the program alleging the same charges. The host issued an investigation.

December 12 – Mrs. Zoraida Rodriguez, is the advocate for a group of parents of students from El Guano Elementary School of the town of Yabucoa, which are opposing the closing of the school, decision made by the Education Department.

December 15 – Parents, students and teachers of Trina Padilla Public School of San Juan, protest the sudden exit of the school's director claiming it is unjustified.
