Issues October 2015

Issues

1. Traffic light malfunction in front of public elementary school
2. Equipment needed at public gymnasium
3. Broken aqueduct pipe in community area

October 2 –Parents are complaining about the traffic light in front of Francisco Oller elementary school, which is broken and makes very difficult for them to get their kids to school. A call was made to the municipality's engineer.

October 13 – After calls from members of Barrio Venezuela, the host visited a community gymnasium, where the neighborhood's youth go to train, especially for boxing. The facilities need basic boxing training equipment, so he made the petition to listeners.

October 27 – Toa Baja citizen, Genoveva Sampris called the show to report a broken aqueduct pipe that has been broken for some time. She has made several attempts with the Department of Water to get it fixed, but has not been successful. This is why she called the show. A call was made to one of its directors and apparently, it is in the process of being fixed.

Issues November 2015

Issues

1. Case of dubious merchant
2. Identity theft
3. House burns in fire and City will not help

November 6 – Mr. Pedro Rivera, bought a small motor bike from a sport bike store and the merchant would not give him warranty on the bike after it presented a manufacture problem. The case was referred to the Consumer Advocates Office.

November 17 – Mr. Jorge Nevárez called the show to present a dramatic case in which his brother is committing identity theft against their father. The case was referred to a Social Security Office. He has already stolen over \$60,000 from his father's account.

November 20 – The house of Domingo Ramos was caught on fire, but because the house was still on his late father's name, the City of Canovanas would not offer help.

Issues December 2015

Issues

1. Out of order elevator at Central High School
2. Damaged air conditioners at high school
3. Low income housing contracts

December 4 – Mr. Carlos Molina, is denouncing that he cannot go to the school's second floor to visit his son's teachers, since the elevator is broken and he is in a wheelchair. The Department of Education was called and also the director to follow up on this matter.

December 9 – Gabriela Mistral High School in San Juan has three damaged air conditioners that make very difficult for the teachers of those classrooms to teach. The Department of Education was called to report the matter.

December 17 – Residents of low income housing of Luis Llorens Torres, are very worried about the new contracts they have to sign and that they cannot have copies of what the document. The Human Rights Commission was contacted to receive information about this.
