AGRICULTURE

Series Title: The Growing Field: Future Jobs in Agriculture

Well over half of Pennsylvania's economy is related to or dependent on agriculture. Agriculture has long been the work of farmers growing crops or raising animals, but technology has opened exciting new career pathways. Plant-watering robots, soilless horticulture, and agriculture-related fields including innovative food production and forest conservation are just a few examples. Meantime, skilled workers in more traditional jobs like tractor mechanics and farm equipment sales are still very much in demand. This 30-minute documentary explores possible careers related to agriculture. Viewers will visit an automated dairy farm in rural Washington County, a busy urban greenhouse in Pittsburgh, a robotic peach orchard near Gettysburg, but also learn that the trending jobs are not always "down on the farm".

This documentary explores the history of the International and brings into focus the work of three artists Njaimeh Njaie, Tishan Hsu, and James YaYa Hough -- whose provocative work exemplifies our changing world and its challenges.

One in five mothers struggle with perinatal mood and anxiety disorders, yet 75% go untreated. Depression, anxiety, PTSD, and other psychological difficulties are the most common complications of pregnancy and postpartum. While the ongoing stigma of mental illness continues to prevent many in the general population from getting treatment, some people are at a higher risk. Women of color, women living in rural areas and birthing people within the LGBTQIA+ community are less likely to get treatment or unable to seek help. And when they do, they are more likely to face discrimination or biased treatment. In Western Pennsylvania, family-focused mental health care, support groups and doulas that provide birthing companionship are helping turn the tide. New research, medication and culturally competent providers are also showing improved outcomes. Yet, there is much to be done. This documentary introduces individuals and families whose lives have been profoundly impacted by maternal mental health conditions while also highlighting the people and programs working for positive change

With direct connections to depression, suicide, dementia, stroke, coronary disease and poor sleep, isolation is having an ominous and widespread effect. As many as 40 percent of American adults report feeling cut off from meaningful family and community connection. The COVID pandemic only made things worse with an alarming spike in teenage mental health issues. In 2020, U.S. Surgeon General Vivek Murthy raised "loneliness" as a public health issue. This 30-minute documentary introduces a diverse group of people who speak candidly about how isolation exacerbated their experiences with alcoholism, suicide attempts, and emotional trauma, as well as the stigma associated with admitting to being lonely. The program also features ways in which those at risk for isolation's worst consequences are reaching out to make positive, new social connections.

Series Title: Bundle of Nerves: Our Anxiety Epidemic

The Pittsburgh Penguins have launched a unique hockey program designed to provide training, social and mentorship opportunities for African American youth. It is named for the NHL's first Black player, Willie O'Ree, who made his debut with the Boston Bruins in 1958. O'Ree would face a myriad of racist taunts and unfair treatment during his career, ultimately emerging as a lifelong advocate for players of color and economically disadvantaged youth. Black players and audiences remain significantly under-represented in the NHL, and in all phases of hockey. But the Pens are working for positive change. Unlike other programs, the Academy is not focused on getting kids of color on skates for the first time. Most participants are already seasoned players. But they are now challenged by new obstacles, often being the only player of color on the ice, usually with white coaches, and only one Black family in the stands cheering them on. O'Ree's legacy is now "center ice" again as WQED explores The Willie O'Ree Academy through the legacy of its legendary namesake and the voices and activities of today's young participants.

Series Title: A Force for Change: Esther Bush and the Urban League

Prattis & The Piano recounts the career of Pittsburgh Symphony principal keyboardist Patricia Prattis Jennings, who in 1966 became the first African American woman to be awarded a full contract by a major American symphony orchestra, breaking decades of discrimination in the world of classical music.

Series Title: The Cost of Inheritance: An America Reframed Special

Individuals seeking to bridge our human divide share their reparations quests and we begin to understand the myriad of initiatives already happening across the country on local, state & national levels to make reparations a reality.

"Fly Boys: Western Pennsylvania's Tuskegee Airmen" covers the "Tuskegee Airmen Experiment", a military experiment to see if Black men were capable of flying complicated engines of war. The airmen flew fighter and bomber planes during World War II and were trained at Tuskegee, Alabama. These are the stories of the men who lived through the experience as well as from family members who remember them. Plus, some white pilots tell how they owe their survival to the heroics of this group of men. The Tuskegee Airmen included pilots, navigators, bombardiers, maintenance and support staff, instructors and all the personnel who kept the planes in the air. This is not to be confused with the Tuskegee Syphilis Experiment.
