ISSUE: Crime and Justice
HOW TREATED: Program Interview—Finishing Strong
TITLE: Reentry into Society
DATE: January 4
DURATION: 12 Minutes
TYPE: Informational
DESCRIPTION: Mark Renick of St. Vincent DePaul of Southwest Idaho discussed the challenges returning citizens coming out of incarceration face. He suggested we minister to the people to reduce the rates of incarceration. Educating people as to what it is like to be in prison is also helpful.

TITLE: Drug Overdose Prevention
DATE: January 1-31, 2023
DURATION: 30 seconds
TYPE: Informational
DESCRIPTION: This PSA campaign provides information about the risks and consequences of mixing drugs, the dangers of fentanyl, the life-saving power naloxone, and the importance of reducing stigma to support treatment and recovery.

TITLE: Support Kids' Mental Health
DATE: January 10-March 31, 2023
DURATION: 30 seconds
TYPE: Educational
DESCRIPTION: For middle school kids a new year brings on feelings of uncertainty and anxiousness. This campaign gives parents a range of tools to help them express their feelings and connect with their parents and support mental health and emotional wellbeing.

TYPE: Education

DESCRIPTION: Michelle Singletary discusses wise money management during the economic downturn. She provided the basics of getting out of debt, budgeting, and saving money when money is tight.

DESCRIPTION: Steve interviews John Mitchell, Founder and Executive Director of Inspire Idaho who describes what happens when children age out of the Foster Care System. Many of them who do not graduate into healthy organizations end up incarcerated.

TITLE: Smithsonian Lawsuit
DATE: February 7, 2023
DURATION: 26 Minutes
TYPE: Call-in Program

DESCRIPTION: Jay and Jordan Sekulow answer listener's phone calls regarding their lawsuit against the Smithsonian National Air and Space Museum. The lawsuit involves the violation of the student's First Amendment rights in kicking out a group of Christian students wearing "pro-life beanies."
