HOW TREATED: PSA/Live Read  
TITLE: Hurricane Ian Volunteer Ask  
DATE: October 4-23  
DURATION: 60 seconds  
TYPE: Informational  
DESCRIPTION: Samaritan's Purse is responding to help families affected by Hurricane Ian in Southwest Florida. The disaster relief teams need volunteers to help in ground assistance for homeowners.
