ISSUE: Lifestyle
HOW TREATED: Program Interview—Finishing Strong
TITLE: Writings of the Founding Fathers
DATE: July 1
DURATION: 26 Minutes
TYPE: Educational
DESCRIPTION: Winston Sanders quoted many examples of speeches and writings of the founders of our nation who framed our founding documents so as to highlight, enumerate, and enshrine religious liberty.

ISSUE: Lifestyle
HOW TREATED: Program—Breakpoint
TITLE: The American Creed
DATE: July 4
DURATION: 4 Minutes
TYPE: Educational
DESCRIPTION: This program was a replay of Chuck Colson’s commentary on the clarity of the Declaration of Independence which states that our rights are ultimately granted by God, not by the State. This creed is something that is too often forgotten today.

TYPE: Informational
DESCRIPTION: Steve interviews Jacki Briggs, and Cary Salazar of about PTSD which has occurred in many veterans. They provided a wide scope of networked connection that can provide therapies and services for those suffering from PTSD.

depression. He admonished listeners to listen to their body to see if things don't seem right and to seek counseling if the change in intensified or in duration.
