Huifeng "Haha" Liu, a Chinese businessman and also a Liberal Party donor, whom in over the past five years had developed relationships with federal Assistant Treasurer Michael Sukkar and MP Gladys Liu engaged in "acts of foreign interference" and activities for Beijing, according to Australia's domestic spy agency. The 52-year-old stepped down as the president of a popular neighbourhood watch organisation which was also an official agency for the Chinese government, after ASIO deemed him a national security risk last year. The bombshell findings by the Australian Security Intelligence Organisation (ASIO) are contained in Melbourne-based Chinese businessman Huifeng "Haha" Liu's court application to fight the Federal Government to avoid deportation. The case of Mr Liu, who ingratiated himself with Liberal Party MPs over the past five years, is a rare test of Australia's opaque strategy to counter alleged Chinese government interference by cancelling visas.

President Biden signed three executive orders on Tuesday (2nd) to overturn the immigration-related regulations of former President Trump, including the "zero tolerance" measures for breaking up families of undocumented immigrants at the US-Mexico border.

According to reports, in one of the executive orders, Biden instructed the Secretary of Homeland Security to lead a task force to reunite hundreds of families of undocumented immigrants who had been dismantled during Trump's tenure. The other two executive orders were for a comprehensive review. Trump's immigration policies include restrictions and reductions in asylum applications, suspension of overseas assistance programs, and raising the threshold for applying for green cards or naturalization, and other regulations that slow down the entry of legal immigrants into the United States.

A Boeing 747-400 cargo plane of Longtail Airlines in Bermuda, the engine caught fire shortly after take-off on Sunday (21st). Metal fragments were scattered in the province of Limburg in the southeast of the Netherlands, injuring two people. The British media "Guardian" once included a photo of Air China in a related report. The Chinese Embassy in the UK expressed

strong dissatisfaction with this on Wednesday (24th) and reserves the right to make further responses. In response to the reporter's inquiry, the spokesperson of the Chinese Embassy stated that the incorrect distribution of news pictures bearing the Air China logo in relevant reports has a negative impact on the image of Chinese companies and misleads readers. This is a typical irresponsible and inaccurate report. The embassy asked the relevant media to explain and make corrections immediately, and apologize to the victims of the "fake news pictures." The spokesperson also said that the inaccurate reports are not a single example, but reflect the disregard of journalistic professional ethics and deep-rooted prejudice against China by some Western media. China urges relevant media to take off their colored glasses and treat China and its development in an objective and fair manner.
