New York City's order to compel public school staff to be vaccinated against the new crown will take effect on Monday (4th), otherwise they will be forced to take unpaid leave from this week and may even be fired. 8,000 of the city's 148,000 public school staff, 3,000 of the 78,000 teachers, and 12 of the 1,600 principals were placed on the unpaid leave list or fired because they refused to get an injection. On the same day, thousands of educators took to the streets to express their dissatisfaction and opposed compulsory vaccination. The New York City Teachers Union stated that 3,000 members have submitted applications for exemption from injections, of which about 1,000 have been approved, mostly for medical reasons.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) advisory committee recommended on Tuesday (26th) that children aged 5 to 11 be vaccinated with the Pfizer-BioNTech novel coronavirus vaccine, pointing out that the novel coronavirus vaccine has more advantages than disadvantages for this age group. Once FDA finalize on the authorization, the Advisory Committee of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) will discuss vaccination arrangements next week, and CDC director will make the final decision.

Multiple cities in the United States held Mayoral Elections on Tuesday (2nd). The most notable of these were the election of former Democratic African-American policeman Eric Adams as Mayor of New York, and Taiwanese Democratic candidate Michelle Wu (Michelle Wu) elected as Mayor of Boston, becoming the city's first female Mayor of color. Adams won 66.5% of the vote, far away from the Republican opponent Curtis Sliwa's 28.8% of the vote. He is the second African-American Mayor of New York City. He will succeed the current Democratic Mayor de Blasio in January next year. In Boston, Michelle Wu, a descendant of Taiwanese immigrants, defeated fellow Democrat Annissa Essaibi George with more than 60% of the votes, ending the city's 200-year-old mayor by a white male.

On Tuesday (23rd), U.S. media quoted from source that the U.S. Biden administration will announce as soon as the same day of this report, that it will lend oil from the Strategic Petroleum Reserve in response to the energy price reduction plan reached with the major oil consuming countries in Asia. According to reports, India, Japan and South Korea will also release oil reserves together. According to people familiar with the plan, the United States is considering releasing more than 35 million barrels of emergency oil reserves, but the situation is still undecided and the plan may change. The White House said that it has not yet made a decision on the release of oil reserves. The U.S. has been in contact with other countries and is considering a series of measures to ease prices. Once implemented, this will be an unprecedented response by many major oilconsuming countries after the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries and its allies (OPEC+) rejected the United States' call for increased production, or will require OPEC+ to re-evaluate its production increase plan.

On December 7, 1941, the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor in Hawaii, killing more than 2,400 American soldiers and civilians, but did not damage the main force of the US Navy. The United States declared war on Japan soon after, reversed the situation of World War II.
