Topic: FDA clears use of Pfizer COVID vaccine in 12-15 age group

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) announced on Monday (10th) that it will expand the emergency use authorization of the new crown vaccine jointly developed by the U.S. pharmaceutical company Pfizer and the German biotech company BioNTech to adolescents aged 12 to 15 before the start of the next school year. Vaccination paved the way. FDA Acting Commissioner Janet Woodcock said that Pfizer vaccine's approval to expand emergency use authorization will bring the nation closer to normal. She also urged parents and guardians to rest assured because the FDA has strictly and thoroughly reviewed all data. After Pfizer vaccine obtains emergency use authorization from the FDA, the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practice (ACIP) of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) will vote later to decide whether to pass the FDA's decision. The voting results will be submitted to CDC Director Redfield (Robert Redfield) approved. Pfizer recruited 2,260 12 to 15-year-olds for testing in March, and the results showed that the vaccine is 100% effective for people in these age groups.

New York City Mayor Bill De Blasio announced on Monday (24<sup>th</sup>) that in response to the slowdown of the epidemic, remote teaching will no longer be available in this fall semester, and face-to-face classes will be fully resumed. This is seen as an important step towards the full restart of the largest American school system. De Blasio said that in this school year, most of the approximately 1 million students in New York City, about 600,000 students have stayed at home for class. But when this fall semester begins on September 13, all students and faculty will stay in school all day. He pointed out that many parents can breathe a sigh of relief. Chairperson of the New York Federation of Teachers welcomes the decision and believes that the more students who return to school under safe conditions, the better; but believes that some

students with extremely poor physical conditions will find it difficult to return to school in person during the epidemic. Online lessons are still an option for them.

Topic: John McAfee, founder of McAfee anti-virus software, found dead in Barcelona prison cell

John McAfee, founder of the American anti-virus software McAfee, was arrested at Barcelona Airport in Spain on suspicion of tax evasion in October last year. He hanged himself in a Barcelona prison cell on Wednesday (the 23rd). According to the indictment of US Department of Justice, the 75-year-old McAfee concealed the income from the promotion of cryptocurrency, consulting work, speech activities and the sale of autobiographical copyright, and did not file tax returns from 2014 to 2018. He claimed in 2019 that due to ideological reasons, he had not paid taxes to the U.S. government in the past eight years. In the same year, he left the U.S. and lived on a mega- yacht with his wife. He was arrested in at the Barcelona airport before boarding flight to Istanbul last year.
