Topic: COVID19 Diagnosis exceeded 30,000 nationwide; New York City medical supplies may

be exhausted

The epidemic situation of New Coronary Pneumonia is severe. There are 31,057 confirmed cases of New Coronary Pneumonia in the United States, of which 390 people have died. In New York State, where the epidemic is most severe, Governor Como said on Sunday (22) that the number of diagnoses in New York State has increased to 15,168 and 114 deaths. Although Washington has declared New York a "major disaster zone" for the epidemic, Como said that New York State has not received any funds from the first new coronary pneumonia bill passed by Congress, but New York has the greatest demand. Como called on the federal government to nationalize the production and acquisition of medical supplies, because the current state of panic buying behavior has caused the price of medical supplies to soar. He pointed out that the price of a N95 mask has increased from 0.85 US dollars (about 6.7 Hong Kong dollars) to 7 US dollars (about 54.6 Hong Kong dollars), and the state government has no way to solve this problem. He pointed out that he's now facing the situation of competition with California, Illinois and Florida, this should not have happened.
