Topic: Speaker of the House of Representatives has not yet been elected in 6 rounds of voting

After three more rounds of voting on Wednesday (4th), the U.S. House of Representatives, which is controlled by Republicans, has yet to elect a speaker. President Biden said the current deadlock is embarrassing. In the 4th to 6th rounds of voting held on Wednesday, the same result appeared. The nominated Republican leader McCarthy only got 201 votes, and the Democratic leader Jeffries got 212 votes, while 20 Republicans who did not vote for McCarthy Party MPs concentrated their votes on another party member, Byron Donalds. Even though one Republican congressman abstained in all three rounds of voting, the threshold for being elected speaker was reduced from 218 votes to 217 votes, but McCarthy still did not get enough votes to be elected. The House of Representatives then announced an adjournment until 8:00 p.m. Eastern Time on Wednesday (9:00 a.m. Hong Kong Time Thursday). Earlier, President Biden said before leaving the White House for an inspection in Kentucky that he was concerned about the stalemate in the election of the Speaker of the House of Representatives, describing the situation as embarrassing, ugly and not a good thing, and hoped that lawmakers could work together. The speaker of the House of Representatives is usually chosen on the first day of a new congressional session so that newly elected members can be sworn in. With the speaker vacant, the House of Representatives was unable to adopt new rules of procedure, and the legislative agenda came to a standstill.

Memphis police on Saturday permanently deactivated the unit of the five officers who's involved in the fatal beating resulting in the death of a young Black man, 29-year-old Tyre Nichols. The five officers, who were also Black, had belonged to Memphis' Scorpion unit, which was launched in November 2021 with the intent of reducing illegal activity in crime hotspots, including by blanketing those areas with more officers.

Two 7.8-magnitude earthquakes struck Turkey's southern province bordering Syria on Monday, raising the death toll in both countries to more than 5,000 and injuring more than 20,000 on Tuesday. The ruthless natural disaster destroyed many families, and many victims were still buried in the rubble, but the temperature dropped to close to zero degrees Celsius, coupled with power outages and network outages in some disaster-stricken areas, making rescue operations more difficult. The World Health Organization estimated that the death toll from the quake could eventually reach more than 20,000.

On Wednesday (22nd), U.S. President Biden ended his four-day trip to Poland and Ukraine on the eve of the first anniversary of the Russia-Ukraine war. Two months after he became president, he also fell down three times in a row on the stairs of an airplane. The White House has not yet responded to the incident. In March 2021, Biden visited Atlanta, Georgia after a serious shooting, and fell three times in a row when boarding Air Force One on his return journey. A White House spokesman said afterwards that it was "very windy", that Biden's health was fine.

Nikki Haley, former U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations who announced her candidacy for the 2024 U.S. Presidential Election, recently suggested that candidates over age of 75 should take mandatory intelligence tests. In an interview broadcast on Monday (6th) US time, the first lady of the United States, Jill, refuted that the idea is absurd, and even pointed out that the question of whether her husband Biden would be tested would never be discussed. Gill refuted the claim that Biden is too old to run for re-election, and asked how many 30-year-olds can go to Poland and then take a 9-hour train to Ukraine to meet with President Zelensky. Although Biden has not yet announced his re-election bid, Gill said she fully supports her husband's re-

election bid, but it Biden's decision. If Biden wins re-election next year, he will be 82 when he takes the oath.

Topic: White House declares major disaster as tornado hits Mississippi

Mississippi and the southern regions of the United States has been hit by violent tornadoes last Friday (24th), killing at least 26 people so far. The White House issued a statement on Sunday (26th) approving Mississippi to enter a state of major disaster. The Mississippi State Emergency Agency stated that houses and infrastructure in many places were severely

damaged, and rescue is still in progress. A new round of storms is expected to form in eastern Texas on Sunday afternoon, and may enter Louisiana, Mississippi, and eventually Alabama in the afternoon and evening.
