New York City has entered the first phase of resumption starting Monday, the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 2020. It is expected that roughly 200,000 to 400,000 New Yorkers will be returning to work, responsible for operating the New York City subway bus, Long Island Railroad (LIRR) and Northern Railroad (Metro-North Railroad) The Metropolitan Transportation Agency (MTA) announced that subways and buses will continue to operate as usual. Subways will continue to stop operating in the early morning hours for train cars to be sterilized and disinfected with ultraviolet lights (UVC). To avoid close contacts, Long Island and Metro-North Railways will continue to suspend cash ticket purchases.

Topic: Atlanta (Georgia) police fatally shot an African-American man outside of a Wendy's

drive-thru

Last Friday night (June 13, 2020), a 27-year-old African-American man, Rayshard Brooks, felt a sleep in his car on the driveway of the Wendy's drive-thru in Atlanta, Georgia, and blocking the driveway of the fast food restaurant. Two officers came after staff of the restaurant called the police, and conducted an sobriety test for Brooks. Test failed, officers attempted to arrest Brooks which he resisted and tried to fleet. And at one point snatched the officer's Taser as he ran where the officers shot him on the back during the chase. Atlanta police Erika Shields resigned 24 hours later on Saturday after video of this shooting emerged and as protests over police brutality and racism continued for the third straight weekend. Atlanta Mayor Keisha Lance Bottoms, who announced Shields's departure, also called for the immediate termination of the police officer involved in the shooting of 27-year-old Rayshard Brooks after a DUI stop, saying she did not "believe that this was a justified use of deadly force."
