Nearly 130,000 people in the United States have died from the coronavirus and more than 2,800,000 people have been infected, <u>according to the Centers for Disease Control and</u> <u>Prevention</u>.

Both Florida and Texas reported their biggest daily rise in new confirmed cases over the past few days, with Florida reporting <u>11,443 new resident cases on Saturday</u> and another 9,999 on Sunday. Texas reported a record <u>8,258 new cases on Saturday</u> followed by 3,449 on Sunday. California reported 5,410 new cases on Sunday and Arizona reported <u>3,536 new COVID-19 cases on Sunday</u>.

"I will tell you, a month ago one in 10 people were testing positive. Today, it's one in four," <u>Houston Mayor Sylvester Turner told CBS</u>. "The number of people who are getting sick and going to the hospitals has exponentially increased. The number of people in our ICU beds has exponentially increased. In fact, if we don't get our hands around this virus quickly, in about two weeks our hospital system could be in serious, serious trouble."
