Arkansas has seen yet another triple-digit increase in new coronavirus cases as the number of people hospitalized with COVID-19 reaches its highest point since the pandemic began. Gov. Asa Hutchinson announced the state saw 728 new cases today (Tues) bringing the total to 34,655, while an additional 11 COVID-19 deaths brought the state's death toll to 374. Speaking in his daily briefing, Hutchinson said schools in Arkansas are still on track to reopen between August 24<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>.
