# Issues Programs List Quarterly Issues Programs List Stations: KPQ-AM, KYSP, KKWN, KWNC July 1st, 2023 through September 30th, 2023

#### Section I. Issues

The stations have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. **Summer Travel Plans: Making the Most of Your Local Area:** The North Central Washington area is a recreational mecca and an important tourism destination. The local economy is somewhat dependent on the consumer spending and tax revenue it generates. With the economic downturn nationwide, regional tourism may be an important economic boost as travelers stay closer to home, even locals spending recreation and vacation dollars in their own community.
- B. **Growing Risk of Wildfires:** North Central Washington is no stranger to wildfire, with the Lake Wenatchee region annually listed in the top five at risk areas in the country. Surrounded by National Forest land, thousands of acres are prone to wildfire due to forest management policy and human activity. Local government, private groups plus state and federal officials stress the importance of wildfire preparedness on a nearly year-round basis in the region.
- C. **Toxic Green Energy Concerns:** The North Central Washington region is dominated by hydropower. Wind turbine farms operate in the area and plans to add large solar panel arrays are in the development stage but there has been no construction yet. The regional debate here has been over why hydropower's clean and renewable attributes have been overlooked vs. the impacts of wind and solar on the landscape and environment.
- D. Back to Work in Office or Remotely, What About the Risk to Others Post-Pandemic: While the larger metropolitan areas and large employers embraced remote work, smaller areas like our region and employers here were more likely to maintain the traditional work setting with other safety measures in place. Now that the pandemic is over but COVID cases on the rise, how will employees feel about workplace safety and will employers be less tolerant of employee fears.
- E. Are We Aging Gracefully: The Wenatchee Valley is a medical hub for the region because of its elderly population and older median age. While many retirees move here for the climate and recreational opportunities, many in the senior community cannot take advantage of the things here that could add years to their life if they enjoyed better health and were aging more gracefully.
- F. **This Is Tick Season in North Central Washington:** The Wenatchee area's foothills and trails are filled with recreationists all summer but the abundant deer population helps spread ticks through the brush and grassy areas where people can be bitten. The wildlife venture into neighborhoods and can spread ticks onto residential landscaping which poses a threat to people or pets in their own backyard. The disease ticks spread can be debilitating.
- G. Is Caffeine Safe for Teenagers? One of the favorite activities of teens in Wenatchee is to get coffee with friends, especially among girls. Most baby boomers will probably remember warnings about coffee stunting your growth but now, most any coffee shop will have a number of young people socializing there. Is the old warning a myth and is caffeine intake too high for the average teenager today?

H. **Air Quality Dangers in NCW:** The North Central Washington region is frequently under Air Quality Alerts from the Washington Department of Ecology. The smoke from local or regional wildfires sometimes hundreds of miles away settles into the Wenatchee Valley and prompts warnings for dangerous conditions several times each year. The poor air quality can last for days at a time and more precautions should be taken by the public.
