Pamm Larry has become a significant voice for labeling GMOs across the country. Tonight we are taking to her on the phone from San Francisco where she is meeting (or has met with?) Senator Feinstein about Senage Bill 2609.

According, to Mother Jones, "[Earlier this summer], the food industry was preparing to place labels on food products that contain genetically modified ingredients. But if a bi-partisan deal cobbled together [in June] in the Senate Agriculture Committee gets signed into law, widespread labeling likely won't come to pass. Instead, food companies will have the option of disclosing GM ingredients on their products with QR codes that can be read by smartphones, accompanied by only the words "scan here for more food information"—without direct on-package mention of GMOs." Our guest tonight is Pamm Larry, head of LabelGMOs here in California. Welcome, Pamm. Thanks for taking the time to talk with us.

In an article in the Chico Enterprise Record on June 23, Heather Hocking wrote, "Barbara Vlamis, director of Chico-based AquAlliance.net, was dancing on the grave of the Delta Plan Thursday.

Her group was a among a coalition that challenged the environmental review of the plan, which includes plans for the hotly-contested twin tunnels.

However, a judge's decision in May, and a clarification this week, invalidated the plan because it did not meet the laws passed by the state legislature in 2009. Because the plan was invalidated, the questions about compliance with environmental review laws don't apply, Judge Michael Kenny stated in a six-page document released Thursday.

AquAlliance has been strongly against the idea of the twin tunnels since the days when the state was still calling for a canal around the delta. Her group was among those that filed a lawsuit against the Delta Plan in June 2013.

With us (in the studio or on the phone) is Barbara Vlamis, Executive Director of AquAlliance to explain to us what this all means. Welcome, Barbara.

1. AquAlliance, under your leadership, has been fighting this battle against the Delta Plan and the Twin Tunnels for several years. What were the bases of your objections to the Delta Plan and how did you undertake to stop it? What was the nature of the suit?
2. Legal battles are enormously expensive. How have you managed to fund these lawsuits? [Talk about the need for contributions; the need for wide grassroots support of this ongoing efforts in this case and others.]
3. How did the timing and the ruling of Judge Kenny meet your expectations? Were you expecting this ruling? Was there anything in it that surprised you?
4. What will the next step of the Delta Stewardship Council be? Are

- they expected to do a full environmental impact review? Can they get away with superficial revisions of the plan? How substantive does their work have to be to satisfy this ruling?
5. We read on July 2, just a couple of days ago, that "SouthernCalifornia's largest water supplier, [the Metropolitan Water District,] has been cleared to buy sprawling farmland in the Sacramento-San Joaquin River Delta that could be used to help build twin water tunnels. . . . They're moving ahead on the \$175 million purchase, despite ongoing court challenges." How long do you think these court battles will drag on? In your visionary mode, what do you see as the outcome?
  6. As we said earlier in the interview, this work is long and hard and expensive, and can't really be accomplished without the support of lots of people who recognize that their contributions are essential. Barbara, how can people contribute to AquAlliance?
