Program: Community Focus Issues: Safety/Weather Air date: 01 APRIL 23 Time: 07:00 AM Length: 18 Minutes

Guest: Sima Merick, Executive Director- Ohio EMA

Topic: Sima discusses severe weather and the different hazards that affect Ohio. She talks about recent severe weather, including tornadoes and wind storms that caused extensive damage and power outages. She says that Ohioans need to be prepared by planning ahead by being prepared. She says that an emergency kit should be part of preparing for severe weather and having emergency plans should you need to evacuate your home, business, or school.

Topic: Darlene explains what the PSWCD is and how its role is to educate people about conserving the land and water future generations. She says its goal is also to instill in the youth watershed knowledge and a desire to be good stewards of our water resources. She says the district partners with other agencies to bring programs to the county residents. The district is currently sponsoring a "Rain Barrels for Scholarships" in which organizations, groups, clubs, and businesses cans support Pike County students while promoting water conservation and expressing artistic talents by decorating a rain barrel for local scholarships. Pike SWCD will provide contestants with up to two rain barrels for decorating for local scholarships. Decorated barrels will be judged and monetary prizes awarded. Scholarships will be awarded to Pike County students pursuing a degree in Agriculture and resources.

Topic: Amy talks about what SPVMHC does including offering a variety of residential and outpatient counseling treatment centers in the counties they serve. Also offering a variety of treatment professionals, including child and adult psychiatrists, a forensic psychologist, counselors, social workers, chemical dependency counselor assistants and qualified professionals. They also offer 24/7 crisis center emergency services via phones and walk-in assistance. She also says the center offers LGBTQ Peer Support Groups. She says the group is not restricted to open clients of SPVMH, but it is restricted to adults 18 and over.

She says funding comes from various organizations, including, Chillicothe-Ross Community Foundation, United Way of Ross Co., and the Junior Civic League. These funds are used only for the needy of Ross Co. Michelle says that they only see clients by appointment only. She says that they conduct a thorough interview process to determine whether a client qualifies for services offered. Topic: Nick explains that Will Battle is a nonprofit committed to help vets and firsts responders. He says shortly after returning from Iraq, he had friend who took his life which is where the Will comes from. After he gets out of the Army and returns home he had heard of a few service members he served with losing their life, KIA and up to 12 others in various ways in a 3 years period. Nick says he got to the point he felt he wanted to do something to try to raise awareness and try to prevent others from reaching the same fate as well as an honor to those who passed. The organization holds various events throughout the year to benefit veterans.

Topic: Stephanie and Melonie talk about asset limited, income constrained, employment. They talk about a new report that shows that in 2021 52.5 million U.S. families could not afford the basics. They also say that seniors had the highest rate of hardship. The study also shows that the racial disparity in the rates of hardship across the U.S. They also say that 2.5 million more U.S. households became financially insecure during the first two years of the pandemic.

Topic: Josh explains the duties of the position he currently holds. He says he is over several investigations that investigate the origin and cause of a fire, explosions and firework incidents in Ohio. He says his department assists local fire departments and law enforcement in combating the crime of arson and bringing perpetrators to justice. He says his office has authority to arrest and prosecute persons believed to be guilty of arson, bombings, illegal explosions, illegal fireworks and other related offenses.

Topic: The Mayor talks about current and new things happening in the Village, including Rio Grande University constructing "The Pike County Center" of which a ground breaking will be held on June 15<sup>th</sup> at the former Piketon High School location at West Street. The center will have 5 traditional classrooms and a fully functioning science lab as well as space for administrative offices and a conference room. He also talks about the construction of a new treatment plant, new water wells and a pumping station that will be completed in about one and a half years with groundbreaking in July. He also talks about the Village purchasing property for the purpose of developing a nature trail in the future.

Topic: Mike talks about his time as County Prosecutor since he was appointed in February 2023. He is completing the term of former prosecutor Rob Junk who was elected County Common Pleas Judge. He says his goal is to continue to prosecute criminals and has hired investigations to help investigate cases that come to his office. He also talks about the Pike Co. Litter/Diversion Program and the hiring of Roger Risner as the diversion officer/investigator. He and Roger say they are cleaning up litter and illegal dumpsites in the county. Men and women with misdemeanors and low level felonies can enroll in the program to have their charges expunged.

Topic: Mike and Roger say they are finding portable meth labs and drug pipes at just about every site they clean. Roger says in some cases, where garbage has been found, they have located names. Those people are located and the person(s) are prosecuted. The guilty are either sentenced to jail or to the diversion program. Roger says the crew finds everything from beds, fridges, and other households. They have also found vehicles.
