Guest: Lynda Lambert, Media Spokesperson, AAA East Central

Topic: Lynda talks about the 100 deadliest days in which summer months are high risk for inexperienced teen drivers. She says that it is the period between Memorial Day and Labor Day. She says it is important to prepare and educate inexperienced drivers for some of the most dangerous days. She says that more than 7,000 people died in teen driving-related summertime crashes between 2011 and 2020. She says that students are out of school and teens spend more time on the road. Lynda says previous research from AAA foundation for traffic safety says that new teen drivers ages 16-17 are three times as likely as adults to be involved in a deadly crash.

Topic: Brock talks about the school still offering Google Classroom that allows students to do school work from home should they not be able to attend school. He says they continue to have a problem with a shortage on bus drivers. He says the district is constructing a building that will be a career development center with funding provided by G.R.I.T. He says that the goal is to have a place where people in the community who work remotely or who have a job that requires them to have Internet access can come there to work in a quiet environment. Additionally, he says that anyone enrolled in post-secondary education of any kind, from recent graduates in college to 30 years old who is ready to get a certification, or a degree can access the Internet and or attend online college or certification programs without leaving Latham.

Guest Nichole Michaels, Nationwide Children's Hospital

Topic: Dr. Michaels talks about a recent study that shows unsafe storage of firearms continues to put guns in the hands of children. She says that experts are calling for safe storage of firearms and new strategies to prevent premature deaths. She says that the study shows that firearms are the leading cause of death among children and teens 1-19 years old. The study also shows most unintentional firearm fatalities in which a child shoots another child involves boys occurring in the child's home or at a friends home. In most instances, it involved firearms that were stored, loaded, and unlocked.

Topic: Angela and Michelle talk about the Community Services Block Grant that funds CAC that is used to help reduce poverty and revitalize low-income communities and empower low-income families to become self-sufficient. They say that CSBG funded services and supports can assist with housing, nutrition, utilities, transportation, employment, education, crisis and emergency services, healthcare, and community asset building initiatives. Topic: Lynda talks about children and pets in vehicles being at risk of extreme heat when a vehicle heats up. She says that AAA is urging motorists about the dangers of leaving children and pets in cars. Lynda says that a child's body rises 3-5 times faster than an adult's temperature. She says that when a child is left in a hot vehicle, the situation could become life threatening very quickly. She also says that animals are also at risk. She says that leaving animals in a vehicle while running errands, taking a break at a rest stop, during a road trip, or for any other reason can have deadly consequences. She concludes by saying that you should call 911 immediately if a child or pet is found unattended in a vehicle.

Topic: Theresa talks about the 2024 COLA saying it's too early for SSA to announce whether there will be an increase. She also talks about Social Security Cards and how to get a replacement card and or change your name. She also comments on how to get a card for a minor child and whether or not a person can get a Medicare card online. She also speaks about grandparents raising grandchildren and the process to draw their Social Security. She advises listeners who need additional information to visit the SSA website or the local SSA office and gives phones numbers and hours of operation for local offices.

He says the grant from the U.S. Food and Drug Administration will allow researchers with the Center for Tobacco Research at the OSU Comprehensive Cancer Center to evaluate efforts of e-cigarette flavors on the smoking behaviors of current adult smokers. He says this study will provide scientific data that is urgently needed to inform the FDA's regulation of flavor use in e-cigarettes. He says the FDA is currently making regulatory decisions about e-cigarette flavors with incomplete scientific data.

She says that medical identity theft occurs when someone uses personal information such as your name and Medicare number to bill for services or supplies that you did not approve. She says that medical identity theft is a billion dollar industry and scammers are good at their jobs. She says that representatives from AAA's across many Ohio counties will soon begin efforts to teaching people about this type of fraud.
