He also gives an update on the recent news that the district has been awarded funding from the government that includes 20 million dollars to build a new middle school. He says that the new middle school is a 54,000 square foot building designed to immerse 4th-6th grade students in new technologies and innovate stem-based instruction to encourage, enable, and empower the next generation of new economy workers and leaders.

She says it allows you to take control of your emotions, behavior, and personality so you can make the changes you want. She also says some coping skills one can apply to manage stress include to lower your expectations, ask others to help or assist you, and engage in problem solving.

Topic: Dr. Segura talks about the "Compact Act of 2020". Compact Act is comprehensive prevention, access to care, and treatment. Compact was enacted by Congress to give free care to any veteran in suicide crisis. Through Compact Act, care is available at any V.A. facility or any private facility up to 30 days of inpatient or crisis residential care. He says it also includes up to 90 days of follow-up outpatient care and ambulance rides to the hospital.

They also address the animal cruelty case from January in which dozens of animals were found dead, many were found undernourished and unsheltered. They said one person was arrested and facing multiple charges.

Medcare notified the county that they could no longer provide this service due to the challenging costs. The county reached an agreement with Portsmouth Ambulance to take over EMS services under the same agreement as they had with Medcare with the exception the county will use general fund money to offset the 1 million dollar agreement and will also put a new tax levy that would cover the remaining \$500,00.

This program offers support for individuals with Alzheimer's, dementia, and autism with a bracelet that allows those that may go missing to be tracked.
