He provided his expertise on what changes have taken place in 2018 that might affect the amount of your tax refund or what you owe this tax season. Most people will see little to no change but those who do see less in their refund likely got less taken out of their paychecks during the 2018 year. We discussed some new changes that help business owners to pay less tax and get more money back this tax season. We discussed that you can no longer write off moving expenses. And we also discussed the best ways to file your taxes. He gave an example of one of his students that did his taxes himself and the negatives that occur with doing that. Including the length of time, it takes to finally receive your refund if you do it yourself. The best bet for most people is just to file with a software program like turbo tax. Turbo Tax makes it easy for you, is cost effective and gets your refund to you quickly. There is also always the option to defer doing your taxes for six months. All you need to do is file a form. But if you owe taxes, you do not get more time to pay the government. Getting an extension only works if for whatever reason you would rather do your taxes after April 15th.

Omega Allen joins Paige Kelton to discuss her run for Jacksonville Mayor. Allen is set to run for Mayor without party affiliation. With a Ph.D. public administration focusing on participatory government and a 2015 mayoral run under her belt, Allen believes that she is qualified to run the first coast city.

Citing the roadblocks created by partisan politics, Allen favors a vision of an administration not restricted to political affiliation. She seeks to operate with an “open door policy” in which community input and involvement. Allen says education and cultural diversity are the keys to reducing Jacksonville's violent crime. Allen says she would work closely with the school board administration to provide the support necessary to focus on Jacksonville's youth. In addition, Allen intends to work with the Chamber of Commerce to attract new businesses to North Jacksonville. Allen stresses the importance and power that her nonparty affiliation invokes and how it extends the flexibility elected officials to meet the values of Jacksonville citizens.

Former Atlantic Beach Commissioner, Jimmy Hill Joins Kelton to discuss his run for Jacksonville mayor. Hill calls out ongoing issues including political gridlock within Jacksonville’s City Council, the sale of JEA, and the proposed demolition of the Hart Bridge Expressway. Hill says that he is seeking a Jacksonville government based on integrity and transparency, two values that he feels has been severely lacking. Supportive of development, Hill says his concern with current city plans is that the taxpayers are not being represented. He favors the development of the downtown core over the further development of the city’s sports complex. Hill says that his goal is to empower a check and balance system between the city councils and the city’s government. Hill says he intends to govern not from the fourth floor but rather through a series of satellite offices throughout the city, to increase the accessibility of his office.
