Summary: Since Iran has been at the top of the news cycle over the last few weeks, I decided it could be beneficial to talk to someone about how we got here. I wanted to avoid current politics on the issue to prevent any issues. We started the interview with the history of U.S. Iranian geopolitical relations which started during World War II. The next big event that happened to cause tension was the Iranians taking over the American Embassy in the late 70's. Then we talked about the role the U.S. played between the Iran-Iraq War in the 80's and finally we talked about the role the 2003 U.S. invasion of Iraq had on relations between the two countries.

Our guest on First Coast Forum was Attorney Giselle Carson, a recognizes business immigration and compliance attorney. Mrs. Carson helps employers hire and retain global talent. This week's edition of First Coast Forum centered around the H-1B Visa(The work visa) and the process associated with applying for the visa through the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services. There are over 300,000 applicants for H-1B Visas annually however, the USCIS only issues 80,000 from among the applicants. To apply, potential candidates must have at least a bachelor's degree from a U.S. institution of higher learning. Applicants with a bachelor's degree from outside the country must have a Masters' Degree from a U.S. college or university. Applicants are selected by a lottery system established by the USCIS. H-1B Visas are only valid for a period of six years. After six years, the holder may apply for a green card to obtain permanent resident status. The applicant must remain in their home country during this petition period.

He said since only people registered as Democrat or Republican can vote in this election, the ballot will look simple. Hogan said he's expecting a 46% turn out for this election. Clay Supervisor of Elections Chris Chambless says their early voting period starts on March 6th and he described what people need to bring with them to the polls and he says bringing a sample ballot can help people save time at the polls and it helps them get into the right state of mind for the general election in November. We also talked with St. Johns County Supervisor of Elections Vicky Oakes and she also talked about when people need to bring but she also talked about how people's ballots in St. Augustine will look different. She says in addition to the presidential primary, there will be a special election for a few questions dealing with city ordinances. Early voting in St. Johns begins March 7th.
