The opioid epidemic has history here in Florida because we did not have laws in place to protect the public. It's what prompted Dr. Pomm to help to make changes to our laws. He also had recently started a program that helps people get adequate treatment after they have gone into the hospital on drug related complications or overdoses. The goal of the program is to save lives which is exactly what it did. People with addiction to opioids need prolonged treatment and help. Sending these people home after treating their medical symptoms only is very dangerous. We discussed how common opioid addictions are, how they start, and the fact that this particular type of addiction affects people of all walks of life because it begins with a prescribed medication.

If there's a pool in the backyard she says there should be a lock on the door, high up where the kids cannot get to it. After that there should be a barrier around the pool like a fence. Dennis also says children should have swimming lessons every year because they forget some useful skills.
