TOPIC: National Fentanyl Prevention and Awareness Day

ISSUE: Health and Wellness

SYNOPSIS: Jessica Gibson from Behavioral Health Services of Pickens County, the Director Prevention Services, and Kim Chastain from Foothills Fentanyl Fight visited the studio to speak about the 2023 National Fentanyl Prevention and Awareness Day. Jessica told listeners about the upcoming Fentanyl Awareness Rally at 5425 Calhoun Memorial Highway on August 27th. Everyone is invited that is interested in helping. The Pickens County Sherrif will be in attendance along with the Easley Police Department, Group FEAR out of Greenville, NARCAN, and the Phoenix Center with its mobile substance abuse trailer. The mission of the Rally is to provide kids with a proper education about fentanyl and other drugs. During this segment, Jessica also informed the community about the upcoming candlelight vigil on August 31st on International Overdose Day. She explained that addiction is a disease so, hopefully, educating the public will reduce the stigma associated with fentanyl use and give families who have been adversely affected anopportinity to grieve. Jessica provided listeners with important statistics—from 2017 to 2021 the fentanyl death rate increased by 520% in Pickens County. Ms. Gibson and Ms. Chastain wanted to stress that there is a big difference between fentanyl prescribed by a physician and the fentanyl that is available on the street. The ladies concluded the segment by noting that September is Suicide Prevention Awareness Month, so they are hosting an event on September 16th from 8pm until 9:30pm. Ms. Chastain stated that the whole point of the Event is to save lives. If one person rides by and gets what they need to save their life, then it's worth the time, effort, and messaging.
