SECTION 1: QUARTERLY PROBLEMS AND ISSUES

- 1. The Coronavirus: As of the publish date of this document, there are over 16,700 positive Covid-19 cases and now over 500 deaths in Barnstable County. Even though over 70% of residents of Barnstable County are fully vaccinated, this pandemic is far from over. Even one of our own broadcasters at CodComm has been stricken by the virus even though she was fully vaccinated. The radio stations of CodComm have devoted various broadcasting efforts to inform its listeners where to get vaccinated, and how to continue to fight the fight. Our hope is that in future Quarterly Issues reports we will no longer need to list Covid-19 as issue number 1.
- **2. Breast Cancer:** Interviews with The Massachusetts Breast Cancer Coalition that offer programs and information on a solving breast cancer once and for all in Barnstable County.
- **3. Mental Health Suicide:** Thousands of Cape Codders are currently living with drug and alcohol dependency, yet nearly two thirds of people suffering never seek treatment. We addressed this subject again this quarter and attempt to increase awareness and seek answers.
- **5. Poverty:** There is an ongoing need to provide families across Cape Cod who live paycheck to paycheck, or who are challenged with work limitations. This quarter we'll discuss diapers!
- **6. Health and Wellness-Blood Shortage:** Interviews and remote broadcasts with representatives from Cape Cod Healthcare's Blood Center that offer programs and information on solving the blood shortage.
- **7. Veterans Affairs:** Several events in quarter 3 helped provide services and fulfill needs for the families of the fallen and survivors of military combat.

- **8. Highway Safety:** During the COVID-19 pandemic, deaths on Massachusetts Highways have actually risen, even though there are less travelers on the road. We discussed accident prevention this quarter
- **9. Economy Workforce Shortage:** Businesses across Cape Cod are suffering during this busy tourist season with lack of employees. With so many collecting pandemic unemployment insurance, the incentive to return to work has been lacking. Therefore businesses are forced to close early and on slower days to cope with the shortage. We offer information on where to find employment this quarter!
- **10. Economy The Blue Economy**: The Cape Cod Chamber of Commerce and the Cape Cod Blue Economy Foundation have officially launched a new perspective on the Cape Cod Blue Economy Project that builds upon our blue regional identity and fosters responsible, sustainable economic development in our blue industries. This is our first journey into this ongoing local dilemma.
- **11. Environment Animal Welfare:** Cape Cod is a sanctuary of wildlife. The protection of endangered and indigenous species to our local area is an ongoing crisis we discuss this time around!
