WKFY broadcasted with the Yarmouth Fire Department on Route 28, WHYA broadcasted with the Falmouth Fire Department on Brick Kiln Rd. and WFRQ broadcasted with the Mashpee Fire Department from the Rotary.

Synopsis: Matt Barry recaps the highly successful 14th annual "Homeless For The Holidays" which In it's second year, WHYA helped the Falmouth Fire Fighters bring in over 900 toys, 800 pounds of food and over \$650 for the Falmouth Service Center. WFRQ's Homeless camp in Mashpee brought in 1960 food items, over 1000 toys and \$6,372. And Finally, WPXC, the granddaddy of them all in Buzzards Bay with the Bourne Fire Fighters, PIXY 103 helped collect over 3,000 toys, more than 4,000 pounds of food and \$19,638.75!!!
