1. Substance Abuse :State leaders have identified opiate abuse as an epidemic across Massachusetts. A recent County assessment of substance abuse said the same, and also called alcoholism an endemic problem on Cape Cod. The issue affects those of all genders, ages, races, and socio-economic status.

2. Immigration & Human Rights: Discussions with local authorities about the controversial issue of people crossing the border illegally, without documentation and seeking asylum along with being separated from their children.

They advocate for people in recovery – or those suffering from opioid addiction – ROAR stands for “Ride for Opioid Addiction Recovery”. Their mission statement – to assist in rebuilding lives from opioid addiction and assist in opioid addiction recovery and transition.

SUBJECT MATTER – They talked about the upcoming ROAR Fundraising Motorcycle Ride on September 9th – throughout the town of Barnstable. The Ride helps to raise funds – to assist with opioid addiction recovery and transition. They talked about how they formed this non-profit – as both have had loved ones – who have struggled with opioid addiction.

All these companies come together every year – for the Seaside Le Mans – an annual cart race of Formula 1-style go carts – on a track they build at Mashpee Commons – with the goal of raising money for the local Cape Cod Community – and yearly selected beneficiaries.

Over the 18 years of the Seaside Le Mans – they've benefitted over 50 different organizations and raised more than \$6.5 million dollars for the Cape Cod Community.
