SECTION 1: QUARTERLY PROBLEMS AND ISSUES

1. The Coronavirus: As of the publish date of this document, there are over 5,750 cases and 253 deaths from Covid-19 in Barnstable County. The radio stations of CodComm have devoted various broadcasting efforts in the fourth quarter to help inform it's listeners in ways to prevent the spread of this worldwide pandemic.

2. Mental Health - Suicide: Thousands of Cape Codders are currently living with dependency, yet nearly two thirds of people suffering never seek treatment. We addressed this subject multiple times in quarter four and attempt to increase awareness and seek answers.

3. Addiction – Recovery: Unfortunately this issue was with us before the Coronavirus and will be with us long after. Codcomm Inc. is committed to continue broadcasting programming that addresses this ongoing local emergency

4. Non Covid-19 Healthcare Crisis: Fear, closures and limited office hours have prevented patients in Barnstable County from access to routine and emergency visits to their healthcare providers. Virtual solutions are revealed.

5. Hunger – Poverty: Although connected to the Covid-19 pandemic in 2020, there is an ongoing need to feed and provide families across Cape Cod who live paycheck to paycheck, or who are completely out of work options. Each year Codcomm's "Homeless for the Holidays" broadcast helps raise thousands of dollars in aid, all kept locally!

6. Special Needs Issues: Related to the Coronavirus, how Cape Cod Community College's "Project Forward" is helping Cape Codders with special needs adjust during the pandemic.
