**1. The Coronavirus:** After exactly two years, we are happy to report that cases of Covid-19 have finally declined in Barnstable County. Nevertheless, the economic impact will be felt for the foreseeable future. We therefore will continue to address solutions to the economic and social impact to Cape Cod, although less frequently.
