SECTION 1: QUARTERLY PROBLEMS AND ISSUES

1. The Coronavirus: As of the publish date of this document, there is yet another surge in Covid-19 cases on Cape Cod, including a positive rate of over 9 % in the town of Barnstable alone. The radio stations of CodComm have devoted various broadcasting efforts in the new year to help inform it's listeners in ways to prevent the spread of this worldwide pandemic.

2. Hunger – Poverty: There is an ongoing need to feed and provide families across Cape Cod who live paycheck to paycheck, or who are completely out of work options. A local church has addressed this need and we broadcast this vital information.

3. Addiction – Recovery: Unfortunately this issue was with us before the Coronavirus and will be with us long after. Codcomm Inc. is committed to continue broadcasting programming that addresses this ongoing local emergency
