January 22nd 8:43 11 minutes Montana Talks Sexual Abuse Mother Krista Kolstad revealed the struggle when CPS took her daughter away and out of state to begin gender transitioning medications. This after her school permitted appearance change to a boy without parental notification.

February 16th 8:07 12 minutes Montana Talks Mahlstrom AFB Lockdown

Sheriff Jesse Slaughter reported that his office was not notified of a lockdown and a shooter event that he could have helped deescalate.

February 21st 8:14 17 minutes Montana Talks Emergency Preparedness Yellowstone County Director of Disaster Services, K.C. Williams pointed out that most individuals are inadequately prepared for an event. In Montana the most imminent threat is from wildfires.

March 4th 7:40 10 minutes Montana Talks Police Jeremy Shea shared the outpouring of support he and his family saw along the sidewalks during a procession for his fallen brother, Sgt. Krinkee.

March 7th 8:43 10 minutes Montana Talks Guns and Hunting Rick Schoening explained I-193, an initiative to open tribal land to a special license to hunt.

March 21st 8:14 11 minutes Montana Talks Guns and Hunting Gun accessory manufacturer Cordova merged with financial firm Public Square for the free enterprise to service gun owners without government or corporate intrusion. "We built our own parallel economy."
