This episode is a compilation of the producers' favorite pieces. It began with piece about The Soulmasters was an interracial soul band founded in the 1960's in Danville, VA. Jerry Wilson (The Soulmasters) and John Irby were the two African-American lead singers of The Soulmasters. The other 8 members of the band were white. Producer Matt Darroch listened as Jerry reflected on his three years in the band, and what it was like touring the South during the height of segregation. And later, the first federally registered Black neighborhood in the United States was Jackson Ward in Richmond, Virginia. The JXN Project was established to reconstruct the gambrel roof cottage of Richmond's first known Black homeowner: Abraham Skipwith. The JXN Project has since revealed renderings for the Skipwith-Roper Cottage. Founder Sister Sesha Moon discusses the project.

The place we are learning about is the Brooklyn neighborhood in Charlotte, NC. During an urban renewal program in Charlotte property of residents was taken by the city and sold to the banking industry for redevelopment. She explains how this not only affected the residents of Brooklyn, but their families for generations to come. She also discussed the key players and how they carried out these tasks. Ken Szymanski hosted an additional segment of this series with Ms. Elizabeth Graves. Much of her family attended Lincoln Academy and she recalled its history. The school was founded by Emily Prudden for African American children of freed slaves. It eventually was taken over by the American Missionary Association. The school had an excellent reputation and graduates went on to attend universities.

On April 1st 1992 as an April Fools prank a radio station shared that Mt. Trashmore was leaking gas and could explode at any moment. It all went very wrong. Emergency services came to shut it down immediately and the station went under investigation with the FCC. Tommy was suspended without pay and returned to work two weeks later. In grade school, many of us learn that America was founded as an exceptional society - a land of religious freedom and boundless opportunity. But Nancy Isenberg explained that Britain saw colonial America as a wasteland where they could get rid of their underclass of poor whites, otherwise known as "waste people."
