HIGHLIGHTS FROM JAN. THROUGH MARCH 2024 POSTED BELOW.

The focus of news coverage this quarter continues to be the Maui wildfires and the Lahaina fire that killed more than 100 people, left an estimated 2 unaccounted for, and destroyed five square miles of historic Lahaina town.

Affordable housing and accommodations for displaced wildfire survivors remains the key concern as the recovery effort continues. With more than 3,000 wildfire displaced residents on Maui still living in hotels, Gov. Josh Green decides against an STR moratorium, saying there are enough units available now through rental and direct lease programs that he expects to have the remaining residents transitioned out to longer-term solutions by July 1, 2024.

The Maui County Council also approved condemnation proceedings for eminent domain acquisition of 20 acres near the Central Maui Landfill to use for disposal of Lahaina wildfire ash and debris. Maui County Council members struggled to pin down the property owner on what it would take, or cost, for the county to acquire the nearly 20-acre quarry. The owner, Komar Maui Properties ended up offering the county 5 acres as a gift, but the county said it isn't enough and wants to use the remaining land for future municipal solid waste and plans to proceed through the courts.

The temporary King Kamehameha III elementary school was blessed in March and opened on April 1, within the proposed 95 day construction period.

The county Office of the Auditor issued a scathing report that Maui County's Department of Finance was under-staffed and ill-prepared to collect transient accommodations tax money beginning in November 2021 when a state law allowing the county to tap millions of visitor-generated revenue went into effect.

As the quarter came to a close, the state approved the purchase of the former 216-room Maui Sun Hotel property in central Kihei from Haggai for much needed housing.

Coverage continues to include live streaming of important press conferences, interviews with key legislators, community leaders and residents impacted by the disaster.
