Older and disabled Medicaid recipients would get more generous benefits. But states could impose work requirements on the program. The bill would let the Senate approve tax credits more generous to people age 50 to 64. Congressional analysts say the current GOP legislation would hit many with big cost increases. GOP leaders released the changes late Monday, three days ahead of a planned House vote on the bill.

The legislation aims to repeal and replace the Obamacare law, which Republicans call a government overreach that has ruined healthcare in the United States. However, they face resistance from conservatives in their own party who have condemned the bill as too similar to the law it is meant to supplant. Democrats have called it a gift to the wealthy that will take insurance away from millions.

Several deaths from a rare form of Cancer have been linked to breast implants. Anaplastic Large cell Lymphoma was first linked to breast implants in 2011. The Food and Drug Administration announce Tuesday, implants have now been associated with nine deaths from lymphoma. As of February first, the agency had received more than 350 reports of the cancer associated with the implants. The FDA said it is likelier to occur with textured implants whether silicone or saline doesn't seem to matter. In many cases when the lymphoma occurs, removing the implant and the tissue around it, eliminates the disease but some women may still need chemotherapy and radiation.
