On Thursday, October 30, 2014, **WBDT News** reported also from ur partners at the Dayton Business Journal Tech Town is getting a new resident. The Mathile Institute for the Advancement of Human Nutrition is leasing about 5,000 square feet of the third floor in building three. Funded by the former owner of the Iams Company, Clay Mathile, this institute works to change children's lives with nutrition. Earlier this month, we told you the city believes Tech Town will be profitable once building three is 70% filled. This report lasted 30-seconds.

On Tuesday, December 16, 2014, **WBDT News** reported Frickers is one step closer to opening in Miamisburg. The city approved the restaurant's liquor license this evening during a council meeting. The new Frickers will be located on 74 at the former Lone Star Steakhouse. Company officials say the establishment will employ more than 100 people. It's expected to open in the spring. On Wednesday, October 29, 2014, **WBDT News** reported Ohio's colleges are scoring some big brainpower. That's according to a new report by Business Insider ranking the smartest public colleges. The Ohio State University came in at number 11. Other Ohio schools making the list include Miami and the University of Cincinnati. The list was ranked based on average SAT scores. The Georgia Institute of Technology came 1 at number one. This report lasted 20-seconds.

On Monday, November 17, 2014, **WBDT** reported Debt levels for Ohio college grads are among the tops in the US. That's according to the project on student debt. The report found 68% of our grads are in debt owing an average of \$29,000, ranking Ohio 11th in the nation for student debt. Among Dayton-area colleges, Wright State had the highest level at more than \$30,000. This report lasted 25-seconds.

On Monday, December 22, 2014, **WBDT News** reported Wittenberg University made the announcement for its 2015-16 academic year. The decision marks the third year in a row that the university has held prices steady. So Wittenberg's tuition, room and fees will remain at 2012 levels for all students. On Wednesday, October 29, 2014, **WBDT News** reported outlining a plan to help homeless veterans in Dayton. The "Homeless Veterans Prevention Act" will use funds to provide \$3-million in health care, transportation and housing to low income veterans and their families. The program will try to get veterans off the streets and help rebuild their lives. Senator Brown will be at the VA Medical Center campus in Dayton at 1 this morning. This report lasted 25-seconds. .

On Monday, November 17, 2014, **WBDT News** reported Lebanon, Springboro, Tipp City and Centerville all cracked the top 15 for most expensive in the state with home prices averaging well above \$200,000. On Tuesday, October 28, 2014, **WBDT News** reported new overnight a family escapes after fumes and heavy smoke fill their home. It happened on South Jersey Street in Dayton after midnight. Crews were able to put out the flames quickly, despite heavy smoke. Firefighters say a smoke detector alerted the family to the fire. Which they say goes to show how crucial they can be. On Tuesday, November 18, 2014, **WBDT News** reported the World Health Organization says it's assessing the efficiency of faster and cheaper testing to detect the Ebola virus. Labs in the hardest hit countries test more than 1,000 samples a day and could've changed where we are today in the outbreak. This report lasted 25-seconds.

On Tuesday, October 28, 2014, **WBDT News** reported a high-level conference on Cybersecurity is happening today. The US Chamber of Commerce will hold its third annual Cybersecurity Summit in Washington. The day-long meeting is aimed at exploring the latest threats as well as the newest solutions from government and business alike. This report lasted 20-seconds.

On Sunday, November 23, 2014, **WBDT News** reported Secretary of State John Kerry has told Iran it's time to extend the Monday deadline to reach an agreement on Iran's Nuclear Program. Kerry, meeting with top diplomats from Iran and five other nations in Vienna today. Secretary Kerry, saying that "big gaps" remain, and a deal is impossible by Monday. President Obama today ruled out any immediate end to economic sanctions against Iran. This report lasted 20-seconds.

McConnell says the pipeline, which would connect Canada's oil sands to the Texas coast, would be a job creator. On Friday, October 31, 2014, **WBDT News** reported we are on freeze watch for this weekend and with old man winter knocking at the door time is running out for O-DOT crews to repair potholes. Last winter was especially rough on the roads and that's evident by a big jump in pothole cases filed with the Ohio Court of Claims. For now, crews are using hot asphalt. But soon they'll have to switch to a cold mix which doesn't hold up as well. This report lasted 20-seconds.

On Friday, November 14, 2014, **WBDT News** reported Dayton plow drivers were out practicing their routes ahead of this weekend's possible snowfall. Twelve drivers will be working early Sunday morning to keep an eye on the roads. But they won't have as much salt to use. The salt dome is only about a third as full as it normally is this time of year. That's why the city's public works director says drivers should get used to roads that are snow covered during storms. On Wednesday, December 17, 2014, **WBDT News** reported new tonight, Kentucky wildlife officials are coming under fire after they euthanized a mountain lion. Officials say a homeowner walking her dog spotted the animal Monday. Kentucky Fish and Wildlife say this is the first mountain lion sighting in the area since the 1990's.
