2 News on Dayton's CW addressing ECONOMY/BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT during the First Quarter of 2017. The issue was addressed in through our locally produced talk shows, news programming, and other programming listed below:

On Monday, January 16, 2017, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, the 15-th annual Flyin' to the Hoop High School Basketball Invitational wrapped up tonight. The event showcases the best high school basketball players in the Nation and here at home. Organizers say this event brings in about two million dollars each year to the local economy. 20-thosand people came out to watch the games over the holiday weekend. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Friday, February 10, 2017, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, Dollywood reopens in a little over a month, and when it does visitors will find several new attractions that have been built over the winter. 250 projects are currently underway between the two parks. That represents about 11-million-dollars in capital investment which is a big boost for the local economy that's been suffering since November's wildfire. Dollywood reopens to the public on March 18th. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Wednesday, March 1, 2017, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, another new record on Wall Street today. The DOW closed above 21-thosand for the first time in history. Analysts say investors are betting big on U.S. stocks. Banks were the biggest gainers amid expectations that an improving economy will lead to higher interest rates. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Thursday, January 26, 2017, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, Dayton Police are looking for two men accused of stealing from D-P-and-L contractors. It happened in the 2-thousand block of Elsmere Avenue Wednesday afternoon. Police say two men stole more than 12-hundred dollars in property from the contractors. They took two chainsaws and a leaf blower. If you can help, call Crime Stoppers. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Thursday, February 9, 2017, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, two men are also due in court today after a drug raid in Dayton. Deantre Reece and Robert Wallace Junior were arrested Tuesday on possession charges. Both are currently in the Montgomery County Jail. SWAT Officers and "Narcotics Bureau" Detectives raided a home in the 12-hundred block of West First Street. They say they found drugs, three guns, drug paraphernalia and cash inside. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Tuesday, March 7, 2017, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, Dayton Police think drugs might be a factor in an overnight crash. It happened at the intersection of West Third Street and South decker Avenue. Police found a man and a woman trapped inside a car that hit a utility pole. Both were taken to Miami Valley Hospital with life-threatening injuries. Police want to talk to someone else, who could have been inside the car. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Monday, January 30, 2017, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, Starbucks plans to hire more refugees in response to President Trump's immigration order. Chairman and C-E-O Howard Schultz says the company will give jobs to 10-thousand refugees in the next five years. The hiring will happen in all 75-countries where Starbucks operates. Schultz also said in a memo to employees Sunday that people who served with U-S troops will be hired first. The memo said Starbucks would help its Mexican partners if they're hit by any new trade or immigration rules. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Friday, February 10, 2017, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, the bill is being tweaked to make it more attractive to potential swing voters in the State Legislature. A casino in Atlanta would create five thousand jobs and, backers say a second casino in another Georgia city would create thousands more. But opponents told lawmakers that casinos would spread gambling addiction and bankruptcy. The bill would allow no more than two casinos in Georgia with a two billion dollar investment required for an Atlanta casino. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Tuesday, March 7, 2017, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, General Motors announced they will be suspending the third shift at its Lansing Delta Township Assembly Plant in Michigan. The suspension impacts about 11-hundred workers and will take effect on May 12th. This report lasted 15 seconds.

On Thursday, January, 26, 2017 at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, for the first time in more than two decades Graham Local Schools will ask residents for additional funding. The district plans to put an income tax levy on the November ballot. The Superintendent says if they don't get more money, the quality of education and financial stability of the district will suffer. The Board will finalize the ballot issue over the next few months. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Wednesday, February 22, 2017, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, the University of Dayton is joining a National Education effort about violence. It's called "Green Dot Week" at U-D. The University is hosting a series of everts for faculty, staff and students. The Green Dot symbolizes any choice, behavior, or action they can take to promote safety. This report lasted 15 seconds.

On Thursday, March 9, 2017 at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, Magic Johnson shared his experiences and what he learned from them with school children in Virginia. Johnson was recently named President of Basketball with the Los Angeles Lakers. The N-B-A superstar recalled how he grew up in a similar-sized Michigan community. He talked about how he was taught the importance of an education and the High School Principal who taught him to be a leader. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Sunday, January 29, 2017, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, Homestay Service, Air B-N-B, is offering free housing to people banned from flights to the U-S. The C-E-O wrote on twitter Saturday opening his offer to anyone denied U-S entry under President Trump's executive order. No timeline yet as to when or how these accommodations will be provided, but the CEO urged travelers who need emergency housing to contact him. According to the company's website, Air B-N-B operates in more than 191 countries. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Thursday, February 2, 2017, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, city leaders in San Jose, California have a unique conception for helping homeless. The San Jose City Council is considering a 16-million-dollar loan to a developer and a homeless agency to build and run the City's first homeless high rise. The proposed building is six stories tall and would have 84 units and would be just a block away from the homeless hot spot, Saint James Park. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Thursday, March 9, 2017, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, strong winds brought down power lines and trees in Northeast Ohio Wednesday afternoon. That caused more than 50-thousand homes and businesses to lose power and prompted road closures. It also let to a ban on certain high-profile and long-combination commercial vehicles from traveling on stretches of the Ohio Turnpike. The National Weather Service has issued a high wind warning for several counties. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Monday, January 30, 2017, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, a new medical device that looks like a swim-cap, could be a major breakthrough for millions of people with Alzheimer's. Banner Health in Phoenix is starting the first phase of a clinical trial with what they call the "Neuro – E-M." The device uses electromagnetic waves that help with memory loss. Patients will wear the cap for an hours, twice a day, for two months. They won't feel or hear anything. This report. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Thursday, February 16, 2017, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, low income families are getting more parenting resources in Springfield. "Bold Beginning" is a pilot program created the Ohio Department of Education. It allows childhood development centers to provide events for kindergarten readiness and provide information for area parents with younger children. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Monday, March 13, 2017 at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, Canadians with Cystic Fibrosis are living about a decade longer than their American counterparts. The new research is based on 50-thousand Cystic Fibrosis patients in both countries. Life expectancy for Canadian patients is about age 50, compared to age 40 in the U-S. Experts think several factors play a role, including diet and health insurance coverage. More patients in Canada have also received a lung transplant. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Wednesday, January 25, 2017, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, and a bill that bars the use of any taxpayer money for abortions passed in the U-S House. The vote would make permanent the so-called "Hyde Amendment", which for decades has routinely been attached to yearly funding bills. It prohibits any Federal Agency from using funds for abortion services. There "are exceptions for abortions that protect a Mother's life or in cases of rape or incest. The bill also bans abortions for anyone who receives government subsidies through healthcare exchanges created by Obamacare. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Friday, February 10, 2017, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, N-B-C News is reporting the Russian Government is considering offering fugitive Edward Snowden as a "gift" to President Trump and deporting him back to the U-S. The unnamed source says Russia has been formulating various "ploys" to "curry favor" with the new President since his inauguration. Snowden has been charged under the Espionage Act, and faces at least 30 years in prison. The former C-I-A employee leaked classified information on various U-S operations around the world. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Friday, March 10, 2017, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, the office of Government Ethics is pushing back over the White House's decision "not" to discipline Kellyanne Conway for plugging Ivanka Trump's clothing line during an interview. The White House says Conway was speaking in a light manner and standing up for someone who'd been treated unfairly. The Government Ethics Office Director says White House employees should be held to the same ethical standard as other Executive Branch employees. The White Hours has not responded. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Wednesday, January 25, 2017, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, people in Southwest Georgia are coming together after deadly severe storms hit that area over the weekend. In all, 20 people were killed in the Southeast, 15 of those alone were in Georgia. At least six people were still missing including a two-year-old boy. Many survivors are now left with nothing, as relief efforts from around the country try to help them rebuild. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Thursday, February 9, 2017, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, California continues to be drenched with drought busting storms. All the water is opening up sinkholes. Scary moments for the driver of this van when it plunged into one overnight. Luckily, no injuries were reported. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Tuesday, March 14, 2017, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, a powerful Nor'easter could bring 20 inches of snow to parts of the country today.
