Court documents show authorities arrested Hartrich Monday, after investigating threats made on the social media platform Yik Yak. The posts threatened a specific building on campus, and indicated he planned a shooting at the school. Several Law Enforcement Agencies, including the F-B-I investigated the threat, tracing it back to Hartrich. He was arrested, and later admitted to making the threats, claiming he did it as a joke.
