Since October 2022, when they started the Vehicle Theft Suppression Operations, they made 38 arrests and recovered 34 stolen cars. They also found things like guns, drugs, and money inside some of the cars. Most of the thefts they're seeing are Kias and Hyundais, but they're also seeing more and more people leave their keys in their cars. A large portion of these thefts happening in the West Dayton area, but every community in Montgomery County is getting hit.</p>

NASA and the Russia Space Agency continue carrying each other's Astronauts and Cosmonauts to space. While on the orbiting space station, a docked Soyuz Spacecraft suddenly sprang a leak in December. A coolant leak likely caused by a micro-meteor leaving a U.S. Astronaut and two Cosmonauts without a "lifeboat" in case of emergency. Then in February another leak. Now another SpaceX rocket is poised for an early morning launch. SpaceX crew-six includes two Americans, an Astronaut from the UAE, and a Russian Cosmonaut Andrey Fedyaev. Steve Bowman is the Mission Commander. They've been training together for months, even with U.S./Russia relations are at there worst in 30-years.</p>

					<p>National Weather Service survey teams confirming three tornadoes touched down from Monday's strong line of storms, including here in Clark County, where the damages is still evident. Through the day, a potent storm system moved through the Ohio Valley, and by the early afternoon formed strong thunderstorms that went on to produce two tornados in the Miami Valley, in Middletown and north of New Carlisle, flipping trees and damaging homes. An additional tornado was confirmed near Columbus, an unusual sight this early in the year. Kristen Cassidy, NWS Wilmington Meteorologist "Typically in February, we don't see the warmth and moisture availability that we need to produce alot of severe weather and in particular tornados across the Ohio Valley." The weather system not only presented risks to the public. Fast moving storms made issuing warnings difficult to get key messages out to the public with advanced notice.</p>

But to prepare, like with other weather emergencies, officials say to keep a safety kit ready, and have a safe location to go to in case of flooding. And do "not" drive, walk or swim through any pooling water, and make sure you follow the slogan on the screen, turn around, don't drown. The water can rise very quickly. It can pond quickly and it can make travel very dangerous as well as anyone who is out, you know, walking around if they're, you know, by streams or rivers, those kinds of things can swell quickly, especially with the kind of rain that we're looking at forecast for today. Officials specifically saying to stay out of puddles and large bodies of water. However a Clark County woman says she has no choice but to walk to her home because vehicles cannot get past high water levels. She says Clark County Engineers are to blame for creating a direct path for water run-off to a small creek and flood her community in Chateau Estates. And after a year, Tessa Cooper says it's a solution to this safety hazard is long overdue.</p>
