2 News on Dayton's CW addressing ECONOMY/BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT during the Third Quarter of 2016. The issue was addressed in through our locally produced talk shows, news programming, and other programming listed below:

On Thursday, July 28, 2016, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, Chipotle is entering the burger business – and the first location of its new chain will be in Ohio. Tastymade will serve burgers, French fries and milkshakes. It will open a store in Lancaster. This isn't the first time Chipotle has broken away from burritos. It also has an Asian restaurant called Shop House and a pizza parlor called Pizzeria Locale. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Monday, August 8, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, a local business is making sure students look good when they head back for the first day of school later this month. Precision cuts in Huber Heights offered free "Back to School" cuts for kids yesterday afternoon. They partnered with "Engage City Church" to help parents cover some of those back-to-school costs. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Thursday, September 15, 2016 at 11pm, **WDTN News** reported, Republican Presidential Nominee Donald Trump unveiled his economic plan today, that he says would grow the economy by 3.5 percent and create a total of 25-million new jobs. He spoke at the Economic Club of New York. Trump stressed the importance of creating a new policy of Americanism to promote jobs and wealth. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Friday, July 1, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, Columbian Anti-Narcotics Police confiscated more than half-a-ton of cocaine inside a shipment of frozen strawberries. Officials said the bricks of cocaine were found with the fruit haul...in a shipment marked for Belgium. Police released cell phone video of the seizure. The discovery was made by authorities checking food shipments. They said 12 of 114 cans of frozen strawberry pulp contained 495 one kilogram packages of cocaine. The drugs could have fetched millions in the U-S. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Friday, August 5, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, an update on the mass murder in Pike County. Authorities say they're operating under the theory that there were multiple attackers. Eight members of the Rhoden Family were found shot to death inside four homes April 22nd in the rural town of Piketon. Few details have been released. Not long after the killings, investigators said they found marijuana growing at some of the crime scenes, but whether it's connected to a possible motive has not been confirmed. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Friday, September 2, 2016 at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, a Louisiana man says his 11-year-old son opened his new video game to find a baggie of drugs. The man says they bought the game from this Game-Stop in Lake Charles. The father turned the baggie over to police, who confirmed it was meth. It's not clear how the drugs would have gotten into the game's case. A spokesperson from Game-Stop says employees check all games, opening and checking them for quality when they're returned, when they're traded in, or when they are sent to other stores. On Friday, July 29, 2016, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, Microsoft is set to layoff over 28 hundred workers over the next year. This, as the company continues to break down its smartphone hardware business. The cuts come after nearly two-thousand people were laid off two months ago. Last year, the company cut 78-hundred jobs. The job cuts are the result of Microsoft's costly gamble on Nokia a few years ago. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Friday, August 19, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, also this morning, Ohio's Unemployment numbers dropped from June to July. The Department of Job and Family Services says Ohio's unemployment rate was four point eight percent in July. That's down from five percent in June. According to Ohio J-F-S, the state added more than 11-thousad jobs in July. We'll have the complete job numbers on our website, WDTN-dot-com, later today. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Thursday, September 8, 2016, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, a series of hiring events aims to put more Veterans to work. Barry Staff created a new program called Jobs for Vets. It consists of regular mass hiring events across the Miami Valley. Organizers say they want to help veterans and family members begin the application process and get them ready to enter the workforce. This report lasted 20 seconds

On Tuesday, July 12, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, calling all substitute teachers in the Miami Valley—our area is feeling the effects of a national shortage. "Parallell Education"—which connects subs to schools—says it usually has 200 substitute teachers in their pool. Right now, they only have 90. Dayton Public schools tells us they only average about 134 substitutes per day. But this year, they're planning to hire more employees, to reduce their need for substitutes.

On Wednesday, August 24, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, leaders of the Vandalia Butler School District are talking "What's New" for students during the new academic year. A board of education meeting was held last night in the Butler High School Lecture room to provide students and staff with an update on the school year. State testing was a popular topic as were other issues impacting students. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Wednesday, September 14, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, we'll find out soon if local schools are making the grade. The "Ohio School Report Cards" are expected to be released tomorrow. Districts and schools will be graded on six components for the 20-15 and 20-16 school year, including graduation rates and K through 3 literacy. Last year, Dayton Public Schools, Springfield City Schools and Huber Heights Schools received failing grades. Centerville and Oakwood City Schools were given A's. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Wednesday, July 27, 2016, at 7am **WDTN News** reported, more apartments are coming to the Gem City. Our partners at the Dayton Business Journal report 800 new units are expected in the next year. That's the highest level of activity in at least a decade. The average monthly rent for those units is expected to be 749 dollars.

On Monday, August 22, 2016 at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, the State Government now says that more than 60-thousand homes are reported damaged after the heavy rains. That's a 50-percent increase compared to reports last week. Officials say some areas are still under water, so even the latest number might not be final. The Red Cross says the flooding is the nation's worst disaster since Superstorm Sandy in 20-12. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Thursday, September 8, 2016, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, a new apartment complex is coming to Huber Heights, said to be luxury style. Miller-Valentine Group hopes to have some units of "Waterstone at Carriage Trails" ready for rent late this year. This is a rendering of what the community will look like. The 192 apartment homes are being built right now, near the intersection of I-70 and Route 202. They're scheduled to be complete by the end of next year. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Thursday, July 28, 2016, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, a possible outbreak of shigellosis south of Columbus at Deer Creek State Park. The Picaway County General Health District says they've confirmed six cases, and more people say they've been sick. All the cases are tied to the Park's Beach Crews were out testing the water today. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Friday, August 26, 2016, at 10m, **WDTN News** reported, there are now 28 confirmed cases of Hepatitis A in Virginia linked to strawberries used by Tropical Smoothie Cafes. The Virginia Department of Health traced the source to frozen strawberries imported from Egypt and used in smoothies in July or early August. All the potentially contaminated berries were pulled from nearly 100 stores in Virginia earlier this month. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Thursday, September 29, 2016, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, a contagious skin disease has been reported in at least two Clark County Schools, prompting Health Officials to alert the public. Greenon School has experienced an outbreak of Impetigo, with the number of kids infected reaching double-digits. The infection can leave red sores or blisters on the body. It's common among children, and can be spread by both skin to skin and indirect contact. Parents at the school have been notified of the outbreak. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Friday, July 29, 2016 at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, Republican Vice President Candidate Mike Pence rallies a large crowd tonight in the Buckeye State. Among the topics tonight, promises that a President Donald Trump will restore law and order, take on radical Islamic terrorism and squeeze the Washington Bureaucracy. Pence says the policies of democratic nominee Hillary Clinton would amount to a third term of President Barack Obama, with an impact that could affect the Supreme Court for 40 years. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Tuesday, August 30, 2016, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, a new bill in Ohio would require all Public School Districts to delay their first day of class until after Labor Day. An Ohio Senator from the Cleveland area and former elementary school teacher introduced the bill. After parents expressed concerns about schools without air conditioning. The Ohio School Board Association and the Dayton Education Association President opposes the idea. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Friday, September 9, 2016, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, an Ohio man said to be worth millions has been living off Government Assistance for the last two years. Ali Pascal Mahvi lives in an eight-thousand square foot home in Russell Township with horses, an in-ground swimming pool, and sports cars. He is said to be worth about 120-millino dollars. But Mahvi says he's been living off food stamps, medicaid, and welfare. Last week Federal Agents raided his home, investigating potential theft and fraud charges. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Thursday, July 28, 2016, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, residents in Bellevue, Kentucky awoke to major flooding in their homes this morning. At least 22 homes in Bellevue were flooded when storms rolled through. The National Weather Service says the area received nearly five inches of rain in a couple of hours, triggering a flash flood warning. This report lasted 2 seconds.

On Friday, August 26, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, clean-up efforts are now underway in Indiana after tornadoes ripped through Central Indiana, leaving damage and devastation in their wake. Governor Mike Pence was there on Thursday for a first-hand look. According to the National Weather Service, at least eight tornados ripped touched down there Wednesday. Some of the worst damage was in Kokomo, an hour North of Indianapolis. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Tuesday, September 13, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, everyone knows that you can help the environment by re-using a plastic bag, but a group of women in Tennessee are taking that idea to a whole new level.
