**2 News on Dayton's CW addressing ECONOMY/BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT during the Second Quarter of 2016. The issue was addressed in through our locally produced talk shows, news programming and other programming listed below:**

On Friday, April 29, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, a long-time Dayton standard with a new name says it plans to keep its jobs here. Minnesota based Taylor Corporation bought Standard Register last year. Dayton and Montgomery County officials have been working to put together incentives to keep the jobs in town. Officials say keeping those jobs here will create a positive chain reaction for the economy. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Monday, May 2, 2016, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, a 2 News follow up tonight. On Friday we told you democratic frontrunner Hillary Clinton was coming to Ohio. Tonight we know where she'll be spending part of Tuesday. Her tour includes a trip to Jackie O's Production Brewery and Tap Room in Athens tomorrow afternoon at 12-15. She'll be speaking on jobs and the economy. She was in Kentucky and West Virginia today. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Friday, June 24, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, since Fuyao Glass America moved to Moraine, the city has seen a positive impact to the economy. Moraine officials say the manufacturer is generating revenue for the city while also creating several jobs. At a Chamber of Commerce briefing yesterday, the plant's president says they might hire two thousand more employees by the end of the year. This report lasted 20 seconds.

Police say the alleged victim is a female resident at the Laurelwood Senior Living Facility. The person accused is a Time Warner Cable Employee. On Tuesday, May 10, 2016, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, a man facing sex charges involving underage girls pleads \*not\* guilty in Court. Bond for 60-year-old Edward Hildebrand the second is set at 2-thousand dollars. He is charged with rape, unlawful sexual conduct with a minor, and gross sexual imposition. On Wednesday, April 20, 2016, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, a technology company headquartered at Austin Landing is planning to expand. According to our partners at the Dayton Business Journal, Sogeti U-S-A will hire 200 workers nationally through its college graduate program. The company has 22-hundred total employees including 220 locally. This report lasted 15 seconds.

On Tuesday, May 10, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, happening today, job seekers can find a lot of opportunity at a local high school. Mad River is holding its first Job Fair, in conjunction with "Ohio Means Jobs" today. It's from 3 to 5 at the Student Activity Center at Stebbins. You can meet face to face with dozens of local employers including the districts transportation department, Fuyao North America, and more. You're asked to come prepared with resumes and dress professionally. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Thursday, June 23, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, Home Depot is teaming up with the Group Recruit Military to host a career fair. It will be at the Dayton Convention Center downtown from 11 to 3. Jobs available include in-store sales, I-T Logistics, customer service and merchandising. Home Depot says it already employs more than 25-thousand veterans nationwide. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Monday, April 25, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, happening today, the N Double A-C-P is doing a community check on education. The group is hosting a "State of the Schools" for Dayton Public Schools. It's happening at 6:30 tonight at the "Dayton Boys Preparatory Academy" on Third Street. The public is invited and encouraged to take part in the exchange. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Friday, May 6, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, West Carrollton School officials say an upcoming levy must pass, or the district won't see any new money for more than a year. This fall, residents will see a 5 point 5 mill operating levy on the ballot. A similar levy failed this past March. That means the District has already started making cuts starting with student transportation. Some say they're voting "No" because taxes are "already\* too high. Others say it's a price you have to pay to get kids a better education. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Friday, June 17, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, Good Morning, I'm John Seibel, topping our morning headlines this morning: Dayton Public Schools announces its new Superintendent. We were the first to bring you this story as Breaking News on Five on 2 Thursday. The Board chose Rhonda Corr from a pool of three candidates. She says her top priorities are improving the districts graduation rate and third grade literacy. Corr come to Dayton from Indianapolis where she was the Superintendent for the City's Public School System. This report lasted 25 seconds.

**2 News on Dayton's CW addressing HOUSING ISSUES/FORECLOSURE during the Second Quarter of 2016. The issue was addressed in through our locally produced talk shows, news programming and other programming listed below:**

On Friday, April 1, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, more campus housing is coming to the University of Dayton. This is a rendering of a planned four-story apartment building at 301 Lowes Street. The 11-million dollar project will add 96 living spaces to the south student neighborhood. They'll be two-bedroom, four-person apartments with brand-new appliances. Construction is scheduled to start this summer. Students can move in in August 20-17. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Thursday, May 5, 2016, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, New at 10, more housing options available in Downtown Dayton. The ribbon was cut this afternoon on the Gem City's newest residential development. Brownstones at 2-nd includes 24 townhome condos. 14 of them are already sold and six families already call them home. Charlie Simms is the developer of the project. He says the convenient location downtown makes these condos appealing. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Thursday, June 2, 2016, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, thousands of dollars will go toward helping homeless veterans in Ohio. The U-S Department of Housing and Urban Development and Department of Veterans Affairs awarded 700-thousand dollars to the cause. The money will be used to help 145 homeless vets find a permanent home. The Dayton V-A will receive 55-thousand dollars. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Thursday, April 28, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, officials at the University of Dayton say there are now more cases of the mumps on campus. There have been two additional cases reported, bringing the new total to nine. Free vaccinations are available for students, faculty and staff. Officials with the Health Department recommend anyone who has not been vaccinated for the mumps to do so. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Friday, May 6, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, health services in the Miami Valley are getting a boost thanks to some federal funds. This comes from our partners at the Dayton Business Journal. "The Community Health Center of Grater Dayton" is getting 617-thousand dollars from the U-S Department of Health and Human Services. The money will be used to increase patient capacity and services for medically underserved populations. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Wednesday, June 22, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, elevated levels of lead found in the water at Miami Valley Hospital. Officials with public health – Dayton & Montgomery County say a recent test showed lead levels ranging between 20 to 200 parts per billion, above the federal action level of 15 parts per billion. The high levels of lead were found last Friday. Since then, the hospital has shut off water, giving out bottled water until the problem is fixed. This report lasted 25 seconds.

**2 News on Dayton's CW addressing GOVERNMENT during the Second Quarter of 2016. The issue was addressed in through our locally produced talk shows, news programming and other programming listed below:**

On Tuesday, April 26, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, a local group is looking to fill in some of the blanks about a possible merger in the region. The first of three Town Hall meetings was held last night about the "Dayton Together" initiative. Members of the "Citizens Against Dayton Together Initiative" met at Bethel Baptist Church. Organizers say they want the public to know the "negative" impacts of merging Montgomery County and the City of Dayton into one metro government. They say the move would eliminate the voting power of Dayton's 140-thousand residents. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Wednesday, May 11, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, the "Dayton Together" initiative has apparently hit a dead end. We have been told the proposal to merge the governments of Dayton and Montgomery County have been withdrawn. Following a meeting on Monday night on the issue, 2 News was told the City of Dayton recently annexed the land in Bath Township the is in Green County. \*that\* transaction snuffs out any planned merger because state law does not allow any community that extends across county lines to be included in a county government. That technicality in essence puts the brakes on the "Dayton Together" initiative. We will continue following this story and bring you updates as we get them. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Thursday, June 23, 2016, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, Volkswagon will pay more than 10-billion dollars in settlements from the emissions-cheating scandal. Most of that money would be earmarked to compensate nearly 500-thousand owners of cars in the U-S. The rest would go to the government in penalties. Car owners could get an average payment of five-thousand dollars depending on the age of the vehicle. That's in addition to getting their auto fixed or bought back by V-W. The diesel scandal was revealed last year when Volkswagon admitted



rigging certain vehicles to pass emission tests by cheating. This report lasted 30 seconds.

**2 News on Dayton's CW addressing ENVIRONMENT during the Second Quarter of 2016. The issue was addressed in through our locally produced talk shows, news programming and other programming listed below:**

On Thursday, April 28, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported with heavy storms ripping through the Midwest, tornado warning and tornado watches have been in effect. At least one tornado has been confirmed in Western Iowa yesterday. Reports of debris and tree damage followed this tornado. It's all part of a storm system that swept through other Midwestern states bringing rain, hail and high winds. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Wednesday, May 11, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, intense storms ripped through parts of Kentucky, leaving shattered windows and splintered wood Tuesday. At least ten people were hurt in the storms. The severe weather brought flash flooding in some areas, with high winds and nickel sized hail. In Breckinridge County, a barn was blown apart, leaving boards thrust into the ground like giant toothpicks. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Friday, June 24, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, the National Weather Service is confirming at least two tornados touched down on Thursday morning. An E-F-Zero in Clinton County, three miles southwest of Wilmington. An E-F-One touched down in Washington Courthouse in Fayette County. And damage in Springboro was not from a tornado. Instead it was a microburst with 80 mile an hour winds that caused the damage. This report lasted 25 seconds.
