On Wednesday, January 27, 2016 at 7am, NEWS reported, Wright Patterson Air Force Base is a big engine for the Miami Valley economy...and this morning we are staggering numbers to go with the reputation. The base announced yesterday...in fiscal year 20-14...it put more than four "billion" dollars back into the local economy. Digging deeper...the base had more than 27-thousand people employed drawing a "total" salary base of 2-point-2-6 billion dollars. And that income is being spent at local businesses. Holly Allen with the "Dayton Chamber of Commerce" says the money coming from the base directly impacts all of our lifestyles. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Friday, January 8, 2016 at 7am, NEWS reported, job seekers getting a little extra help finding work – thanks to a free program at the Dayton Metro Library. On the first Thursday of every month – you can go to the Miami Township branch to learn about training and resources available for job seekers. At yesterday's session, experts talked about the employment forecast for 20-16. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Monday, January 15, 2016 at 7am, NEWS reported, options in education. You have them...and today "Ohio" is joining many states to educate "you" on what those are. It's part of the week-long" National school choice week". Starting today...more than 16-thousand events are planned across the U-S. The mission is to raise awareness of schooling options other than traditional public schools...like public charter schools and public magnet schools. Governor John Kasich issued and official proclamation in support. This report lasted 30 seconds.

On Friday, February 26, 2016 at 7am, NEWS reported, new state report card results show the largest district in the Miami Valley is failing 9 of 10 categories. "Dayton Public Schools" received F's in 9 out of 10 categories on the state report card. A chronically failing school district would have a state takeover after 3 years of contestant F's...but Dayton's low scores for this year won't count. On Sunday, March 13. 2016 at 10pm, NEWS reported, the first four tips off, with a blend of sports...and education. The Fifth Annual Big Hoopla "STEM" Challenge featured demonstrations from various science departments. The event was open to children in kindergarten through eighth grade, and also challenged students to some basketball. Kids were able to win various prizes, including first four tickets. On Saturday, February 13, 2016 at 10pm, NEWS reported, the City of Dayton will be getting some federal help for improvements to the city's public housing. The U-S Department of Housing and Urban Development says it will provide Ohio's public housing organizations with \$74 million dollars in funding. Dayton will be getting five million dollars in funding. Cleveland Metropolitan Housing Authority will receive \$19 million which is the largest allocation in the state. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Friday, February 19. 2016 at 10pm, NEWS reported, the State of Ohio is getting an additional 98-million dollars to get rid of blighted properties and help people stay in their homes. The money is from the Treasury Department's "Hardest Hit" Fund. Since it was created in 2010, the fund has helped more than 24-thousand Ohioans avoid foreclosure. The program has been extended through 2020. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Tuesday, March 22, 2016 at 10pm, NEWS reported, new at 10...the City of West Carrollton is helping make the dream of home ownership come true. Tonight, city council members approved donating three lots to Habitat for Humanity. The land is on West Pease Avenue and Habitat will be able to build one single family home on each lot. The city has targeted that area for revitalization. There are currently eight Habitat homes in West Carrollton. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Saturday, January 29, 2016 at 10pm, NEWS reported, Wright State University gets a boost to its effort to increase health care access in rural communities. The Wright Rural Health Initiative received 700-thousand dollars in donations. Mercer Health Care Foundation Fund donated 400-thousand dollars. Health path Foundation of Ohio donated 300-thousand dollars. The money will allow more residents and students to train and practice in smaller communities. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Friday, February 26, 2016 at 7am, NEWS reported, the C-D-C says three more people have gotten sick after eating locally packaged salad contaminated with Listeria. We told you last month that the Dole Plant in Springfield was shut down after several cases of listeria were linked to production there. Now, three new cases – two in Ohio, and one from Missouri – bring the total number to 18. Health experts say some of the symptoms of Listeria may seem similar to the flu, but there is one key difference. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Wednesday, March 9, 2016 at 7am NEWS reported, the Health Department says its investigation into foodborne illness at "Lucky's Taproom" is complete. 20-cases of Salmonella have been linked to mayonnaise made at the restaurant in the Oregon District. A total of 90 people reported getting sick...and five were admitted to local hospitals. Lucky's voluntarily shut down last Monday, according to an update on its Facebook page...7 employees were tested positive for Salmonella and have been put on leave. A reopening date has not been determined. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Tuesday, January 26, 2016 at 10pm, NEWS reported, Ohio Governor John Kasich says he's "in shock" over his endorsement from the Boston Globe. The paper has a large audience in southern New Hampshire, the first-in-the-nation primary state. That's where Kasich has spent much of his time since launching his campaign. WE spoke with a political science professor at Wright State who says the Governor need to do well in New Hampshire to stay in the race. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Wednesday, February 24, 2016 at 10pm, NEWS reported, Governor John Kasich saying today he is the Republican Party's best hope for beating front-runner Donald Trump in the race for President. His comments came during a Town Hall meeting in Gulfport, Mississippi, just a day after finishing last in Tuesday's Nevada Caucuses. Governor Kasich says he's in it for the long haul...and said people calling for him to suspend his campaign need to "Chill Out". This report lasted 30 seconds.

On Friday, March 11, 2016 at 7am, NEWS reported, if you have not filed your 20-12 Federal Income Taxes...the Government is preparing to pocket your refund. More than 950-million dollars in tax refunds will disappear after the April 18th deadline. You may also be losing out on the 2012 Earned Income Tax Credit — worth nearly six-thousand-dollars. On Thursday, January 14, 2016 at 7am, NEWS reported, a new partnership is looking to help Montgomery County become a little greener. The new business recycling service grant program was announced yesterday. It is a joint effort between County Commissioners and the Ohio E-P-A. Commissioners praised the program for being able to help businesses reduce energy costs and help the local environment. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Saturday, February, 20, 2016 at 10pm NEWS reported, the Government of Fiji declared a state of natural disaster as Tropical Cyclone Winston...with winds estimated up to 177 miles per hour...hit the South Pacific Nation. Fierce winds and heavy rain tore across the Islands which make up Fiji. Late today, the cyclone was tracking along the Northern Coast of the Main Island. Flights were cancelled and authorities urged people to find somewhere safe to stay for the night and not to venture outdoors. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Monday, March 14, 2016 at 7am, NEWS reported, one person is dead after wind-whipping storms strike. Fire Rescue Officials say a tree fell on top of an S-U-V in Seward Park – killing the driver.
