Talbott says what happened in a San Antonio Texas Walmart parking lot is shocking but not surprising. A university of Texas study estimates 300 thousand human trafficking victims are in the state of Texas.

Sessions cited statistics that show nationwide 52 thousand people died of an overdose in 20-15, nearly 60 thousand last year and the numbers in Ohio are still going up.

Stockley waived his right to a jury trial, leaving the Judge to rule, who said in his 30 page decision that the court "agonized over the evidence" but was not convinced of the defendant's guilt.
