On Wednesday, October 28, 2016, at 7am **WTN News** reported, Tim Horton's is also expanding here in the Miami Valley. The Dayton Business Journal reports the fast food restaurant chain based in Canada, is planning on opening a new location in Riverside. It will be at 19-75 Harshman Road and will be the third coffee shop to open in the city this year. The county must still approve the project before it can move forward. On Thursday, October 27, 2016, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, police are looking for a suspect who they say attacked a woman leaving the Hollywood Casino Wednesday night. The woman told police as she was walking to her care around 9:45 with her purse in one hand and her car keys in the other, when she was grabbed from behind. She saw a white male grabbing her purse but she refused to let go, so the attacker dragged her across the parking lot. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Monday, November 28, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, at least seven people are hurt after a shootout across several blocks in Kansas City. Police found people in vehicles shooting at each other. When the bullets stopped, seven people were injured, and there were at least four different crime scenes. No officers were hurt during the incident. One person reported being shot by police and was treated for minor injuries. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Sunday, December 11, 2016, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, a burglar picked the wrong family to mess with. A Miami County intruder is in jail tonight after a family fought back. It happened Friday night on North Rangeline Road outside of Covington. Deputies say the family got home from dinner and found the suspect trying to steal weapons. The homeowner fought the intruder while his wife and kid secured the weapons. The man's son handed him the shotgun and held the intruder at gunpoint until officers got there. Robert Molihan, Jr., was arrested. He is in the Miami County Jail facing aggravated burglary charges. Police are searching for others who may be connected to the crime. On Friday, October 28, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, a federal jury found seven defendants not guilty for their part in the armed takeover of a Federal Wildlife Refuge in Oregon. Brothers Ammon and Ryan Bundy and five others were acquitted on charges of conspiring to impede federal workers from their jobs. The group let the standoff at "Malheur National Wildlife Refuge" that began January second and lasted about six weeks, bringing attention to the long-running dispute over control of federal lands. Supporters say they are overwhelmed by the decision. This report lasted 30 seconds.

On Wednesday, November 30, 2016 at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, Carrier says a deal has been struck with President-elect Donald Trump that would keep nearly one-thousand jobs in Indiana. Trump and Vice President-elect Mike Pence, the current Indiana Governor, will be in that state tomorrow for the official announcement. Donald Trump made keeping American jobs from fleeing to Mexico a campaign promise. Carrier had previously said it planned to close two Indiana plants. One in Indianapolis has 13-hundred workers and another in Huntington employs 700. This report lasted 25 seconds

On Wednesday, December 7, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, the Dayton Public School Board has decided to delay "any" decision to layoff teachers' aids and other support staff until the end of the school year. The crowd of teachers, teachers' aides, parents and community members cheered as the board announced their decision to delay the vote to cut 30-jobs. After the backlash from November's meeting, board members toured the buildings met with employees, parents and students to hear their concerns. Superintendent Rhonda Corr says cuts will still need to be made, but not right now. This report lasted 30 seconds.

The "Ohio Joint Study Committee on Drug Use Prevention Education" held a meeting last night at Wright State University, looking into drug use prevention education. Officials say Oho is not a one-size-fits-all state when it comes to educating students about drug use. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Tuesday, October 18, 2016, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, the President of the Downtown Dayton Partnership says the current vacancy rate downtown is only 3-point-5 percent. Demand for housing right now is higher than the options available. For example, the Water Street Flats opened early summer. They're almost completely full. 600 new housing units are expected downtown in the next 18 months. This report lasted 15 seconds.

On Monday, November 28, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, Dayton Mayor Nan Whaley and several Montgomery County Commissioners will join officials with the Dayton V-A and the "Montgomery County Homeless Solutions Policy Board" for a press conference. On Friday, October 28, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, we're getting answers about Caresource's plan to expand. The nonprofit health plan which is head-quartered in Dayton, has doubled its workforce in the last five years and they're running out of space. The plan is to build a new 7-story office building at the corner of First and Jefferson Streets in Downtown Dayton. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Monday, November 28, 2016 at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, Texas becomes the second state in the continental U-S to confirm a locally-transmitted case of Zika Virus. Health officials say lab results confirmed the virus in a non-pregnant woman living in South Texas last week. The woman has "not" traveled to an area where the virus is circulating. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On, Thursday, December 8, 2016, at 7am, **WDTN News** reported, the Superintendent of the "Northeastern Local School District" says South Vienna School will be "closed" today. The school reported more than 100-people absent Wednesday due to illness. The announcement comes as the "Clarke County Health District" investigates a possible Norovirus outbreak at the school. On Friday, October 21, 2016 at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, meantime, the Republican Presidential nominee, Donald Trump, hit up two important states today, North Carolina and Pennsylvania. In P-A tonight, he talked about his plan to rebuild the military, calling it the largest rebuilding effort since Ronald Regan. He also pressed the need for major investments in our Nation's infrastructure. As well as the need he said, to clean up our quote "rigged" government. This report lasted 15 seconds.

On Monday, November 21, 2016 at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, protecting Donald Trump and his family is costing New York City nearly one million dollars a day. And according to New York law enforcement officials, the cost could continue even after he moves into the White House. On Saturday, October 15, 20163, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, more than 500 people in Haiti died because of the hurricane. It has caused the country to reschedule its Presidential election for November 20th. Officials say it's important include large parts of the population affected by the storm to ensure the legitimacy of the vote. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Tuesday, November 29, 2016, at 10pm, **WDTN News** reported, tonight the death toll stands at three, all killed when the fires suddenly raged out of control, fueled by winds up to 87 miles-an-hour. Hardest hit is the resort town of Gatlinburg where hundreds of homes and businesses are damaged or destroyed. Some evacuees were escorted out on foot by Tennessee State Troopers after downed trees blocked roads. This report lasted 20 seconds.
