



BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.):

This week on CounterSpin: The George Zimmerman not guilty verdict was upsetting to those who campaigned for justice for Trayvon Martin, but it wasn't necessarily surprising to those who have seen too many examples of similar killings of young people of color go unpunished. We'll speak with UCLA professor Robin Kelley about how the person on trial wasn't Zimmerman—it was Trayvon Martin.

Also on CounterSpin today, the state-by state-assault on women's reproductive rights isn't completely ignored by the media; State Sen. Wendy Davis' epic filibuster got a lot of coverage, even is much of it wasn't all that illuminating. But are media treating the assault as the national story many say it is? Also on CounterSpin today, Over the express disapproval of the city's residents, Michigan's Republican governor has appointed an emergency manager to run the city of Detroit, with the power to declare bankruptcy and void union contracts. Some present it as a way to 'save' Detroit from an economic crisis; where others see an anti-democratic maneuver to favor Detroit's creditors over its workers, both active and retired. We'll hear from sociologist and journalist Darwin BondGraham about that.


BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.):

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.):

August 28th marks the 50th anniversary of the March on Washington and Dr. Martin Luther King's "I Have a Dream" speech. It will be aired over and over again. The charismatic orator is forever frozen on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial on that August day. No doubt it was a great and historic presentation, profoundly moving and full of dazzling poetry and inspiring images. But he was to give another address no less significant to a much smaller audience on April 4, 1967 in Riverside Church in New York. There King demonstrated his deep understanding of how the system works. He moved beyond a simple race analysis to include class and foreign policy issues. He forcefully denounced the war in Vietnam. He called the U.S. "the greatest purveyor of violence in the world" and he deplored the "giant triplets of racism, extreme materialism and militarism." Exactly one year later King was assassinated in Memphis where he had gone in solidarity with striking sanitation workers.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.):

The rise in New York's poverty rate as a result of the ongoing recession has pushed nearly half of the city's population into the ranks of the poor or near-poor. Ironically, the nation's largest city is run by a multi-billionaire. Almost on the same day, another report came out saying "Hedge Fund Titans Get Lavish Paydays Stretching to Ten Figures." People are immiserated and dumped into the streets because of decisions made downtown in the suites. Do we lend a helping hand to the poor? Barely. Let them eat op-eds about values and the virtues of hard work. There's billions to fund the latest F- whatever fighter jet but scant little for people in distress. The pounding the needy are taking is particularly severe because much of the social safety net has been shredded. Can anyone say compassion and caring?

From Rwanda to Darfur, modern history is haunted by acts of systematic state violence. In 1915 when Turkey sent its Armenian population on death marches into the desert, U.S. ambassador Henry Morgenthau denounced what he called "race murder." Raphael

Lemkin, a Polish lawyer, was appalled by the Turkish destruction of the Armenians and tried to get European countries to criminalize the wholesale extermination of ethnic and religious groups. His efforts were unsuccessful. During the Holocaust, Lemkin lost many family members in the German mass murder of Jews. He resolved to devise a word that would convey the horror. He coined the term genocide. He gave the crime a name and it led to the 1948 UN Convention on Genocide. But when do atrocities become genocide? At times for political purposes, the term is invoked promiscuously as a cover to justify intervention.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.):

Sexual violence occurs from New York to New Delhi and from Denver to Durban. It wasn't that long ago when even mentioning the subject was taboo. The stigma and shame were overwhelming. Help lines, counseling and rape crisis centers did not exist. In some countries, legal and cultural changes have made reporting easier. But in parts of Africa, West and South Asia, where patriarchy is deeply rooted, survivors of attacks are often blamed and ostracized. Sexual violence takes on many forms. But its underlying purpose is the expression of power and domination over the person assaulted. Take the case of the man in Ohio who imprisoned and repeatedly raped three women over a period of years. During war and civil unrest rape of women and of men is often used as a weapon. Sexual violence in prisons is widespread.

ISSUE: Political Violence and the Disappeared in Kashmir

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.):

During the worst years of the dirty war in Argentina, thousands of people were disappeared by the junta. In response, Mothers of the Plaza de Mayo was formed. Their weekly vigils demanding answers brought global attention to the situation in Argentina. In some instances a modicum of justice was achieved. Half a world away in parts of India, such as Chhattisgarh, poor indigenous women have taken up arms to defend their communities and land against predatory corporations. In Kashmir, state security forces picked up a teenage boy. His mother, Parveena Ahanger, an illiterate woman, never heard from him again. She founded the Association of Parents of the Disappeared Persons bringing together those who have lost loved ones. They hold demonstrations and insist on accountability. In these, and other cases, women are moving from being passive victims to active agents. It's not easy. Sexual and other forms of violence are used as weapons to terrorize women. 

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.):

- Marriage equality sings out in the U.S. states of MINNESOTA and RHODE ISLAND in this "RAINBOW (more than a) MINUTE" (read by TALIA MOSER and produced at WRIR-FM in Richmond, VA by JUDD PROCTOR & BRIAN BURNS, and with brief intro music by JOHN LENNON and THE DIXIE CUPS).

- The sentencing phase in the case of U.S. Army Private BRADLEY MANNING reached its climax this week when the 25-year-old whistleblower took the stand. Manning's unsworn statement was prefaced by testimony from family members and expert witnesses. The first of two reports comes from ALICE OLLSTEIN of "Free Speech Radio News" (with comments by Firedoglake reporter KEVIN GOSZTOLA); Manning himself spoke for only about three minutes, saying, "I'm sorry that my actions hurt people and I am sorry that I hurt the United States." He made reference to the fact that he was "dealing with a lot of issues" but said it was no excuse, and that he had not understood the "broader effects" of his actions. He asked the judge to let him have the opportunity to become a better person and eventually return to a productive place in society -- rather than spend all of the 90 years in prison he faces. While some called Manning's apology a reversal, independent journalist ALEXA O'BRIEN had a different view. She was interviewed by "Democracy Now!'s" NERMEEN SHAIKH and AMY GOODMAN (with brief segment intro music by THE BEATLES).
