

SECTION 1

The Coos Co. Major Crime Team was activated early Saturday morning, following a stabbing in Myrtle Point that left one male in serious condition and the arrest of another.

According to a news release from District Attorney R. Paul Frasier, police were summoned to a residence on Roseburg Road in Myrtle Pt. about 2:07 a.m.

Twenty-one year old Austin Dale Martin, of Grants Pass, was found with stab wounds to his chest and arm.

He was at first taken to Coquille Valley Hospital and later transferred to Riverbend in Springfield where he is expected to survive from his injuries.

With the assistance of a K9 tracker from the Sheriff's Office, police were able to locate the suspect, 32-year old Daniel Joe Speaks, and arrest him at a mobile home residence also on Roseburg Road.

He was taken into custody without incident. Speaks had a superficial knife wound to his leg. He was taken to Coquille Valley Hospital and later arrested on charges of Attempted Murder and Assault in the First Degree. Speaks is expected to be arraigned on Tuesday, Feb. 21.

COOS COUNTY —

The Coos County Sheriff's Office reported yesterday that Raymond Block, the man behind the "leavin no trace" county cleanup initiative, and another man were cited on Wednesday after county officials reported that they were "depositing trash in the county right-of-way without lawful authority."

Earlier this year, the county agreed to waive the pickup fee for trash which Block collected and deposited along the side of the road in places like Libby Lane, the commission reversed that position in June, prompting Block to vow to continue his litter pickup and piling even in the face of legal repercussions.

County officials have called Block's roadside trash deposits "potential road hazards, which pose a significant financial liability risk to the county."

Adding that they told Block they would consider revisiting allowing fee waivers if Block met a few conditions. Namely: provided proof of permission from landowners to collect garbage on their property was able to provide proof of liability insurance for him, his volunteers and the county.

For his part, Block told the World newspaper "I will not fear my government for doing the right thing for the community. Here's your tax dollars hard at work," he wrote. "Nothing will stop (Leaven No Trace) from changing things for the better by acting today for tomorrow."

NORTH BEND — Two arrests were made for a residence burglary that happened on Nov. 6 in North Bend. Deputies from the Coos County Sheriff's Office made the arrests after making a routine traffic stop for a 1994 Dodge Pickup near Whiskey Run.

“It was learned that the vehicle was stolen and had been reported to the North Bend Police Department,” a press release said, adding it was linked to the burglary.

Roberto Perez, 59, of Coos Bay; and Luis Rodriguez, 27, from Guerrero, Mexico were arrested for unauthorized use of a motor vehicle and unlawful entry into a motor vehicle. Both were transported to the Coos County Jail and Booked. Other charges may be pending.

COOS COUNTY — Coos County Sheriff's deputies are investigating a suspected kidnapping and robbery that happened over the weekend.

According to a press release, at 9:30 a.m. on Saturday, a 24-year-old went to visit a family member's home on in Lakeside. When he arrived he found a man he didn't know inside the home's shop. The victim confronted the subject, who pulled out a firearm and held it to his head.

The subject ordered the victim into the house and onto the ground.

“The victim's hands were bound behind his and was ordered not to call the police. The perp then fled the scene in a dark SUV.

“The victim was able to describe the suspect as a white male adult, about 6 feet tall or taller and balding,” the release said.

The subject faces charges of robbery, kidnapping and menacing.

The alert woman called deputies last Wednesday to report a woman dressed in all black knocked on her door on West Catching Road with the claim that she had run out of gas. The resident said she opened the door to look around but didn't see a vehicle.

A deputy responded and spotted a 1993 Honda Civic leaving the area, a vehicle that was suspected to be involved in a theft in Coquille on Wednesday.

After a traffic stop, the deputy identified the woman as Jordan Fry, 27, with Derek Zavala, 32, both of Coos Bay.

"During the contact on the traffic stop the deputy observed items in the vehicle that led him to believe they may have been stolen from a second residence on West Catching Road," police said. "Deputies went to the residence listed on a package they saw in the vehicle and found that it had been broken into."

The residents of that home on West Catching Road were not home, according to police.

Investigators are attempting to put together the pieces of a puzzle that place a vehicle, stolen from La Grande, used in a Coos Bay Home invasion robbery, a hit and run in Canby, at the scene of a fatal police shooting in Washington State.

Police in Clark County Washington received a call Sunday about some suspicious activity on a neighbor's property.

A deputy found a car parked in an empty field, confronted the suspect and that's when things turned aggressive. Shots ensued and the suspect later died at the hospital.

Deputies say the man had a gun and the jeep he was driving came back reported as stolen. And later to be determined as the vehicle involved in numerous illegal activities

It's unknown if the person who stole her car is the same person who was shot Sunday morning.

COOS BAY, Ore. -- Coos County Sheriff's deputies were called to the emergency room of Bay Area Hospital after a report of a man who had been shot in the foot in the early morning hours yesterday.

Deputies spoke with the 50-year-old victim who said he had been walking south on Cape Arago Highway near when an unidentified man approached him.

The victim said the man started yelling at him and then pulled a gun on him and fired several rounds into the ground near where he was standing, the report said.

The victim was struck by one of the bullets in his right foot.

He suffered non-life threatening injuries as a result of being shot, police said.

The incident is under investigation at this time by the Coos County Sheriffs Office.

Deputies received assistance from North Bend Police Department, Oregon State Police in an attempt to locate the female subject. Utilizing the Coos County K9 "Odin", the female was located and arrested.

They were identified as Michael and Rachelle Shamoan who are transients in the Hauser area. Both Michael and Rachelle were arrested and transported to the Coos County Jail.
